

Huron River Chain of Lakes Update

New Website Shortcut: To help everyone get to the Washtenaw County Huron River Chain of Lakes website faster we have created a shortcut. You can now plug in www.Washtenaw.org/huroncol into your search bar and it will take you right to the site.

Reports: We have been posting 2018 reports on the COL website as we've received and reviewed them. Please check back to see if your lake has been uploaded.

Aquatic Pesticide Treatment Notices: Notices have been mailed, please keep an eye on your mailbox. This notice will detail possible chemicals to be used for the upcoming 2019 season and possible water use restrictions. Notices also direct residents to keep an eye out for the yellow posters. These yellow posters will indicate the day of treatment, permit number, contact information, exact chemical used and possible water use restriction.

Request for Proposal Process: We are moving along with the process to bring on a new Lake Manager. We have conducted a competitive bidding process through the County's protocols. Our interviews are complete and we are in the process of reviewing vendors proposals. We appreciate the assistance of the PBWOA on this process and thank them for their time and involvement.
