Entrances available on S. Fourth Avenue and E. William Street.

## PARKING METERS

Meters are located on most streets in and around downtown. Meters are \$1.70/hour Monday through Saturday, 8 am to 6 pm. Parking time limits are posted on meters and space markers. Legal parking durations vary from 15 minutes to 10 hours. Always check signs carefully before parking and park only up to the maximum time posted for that meter.

With nearly every bus route beginning and ending in downtown Ann Arbor, taking an AAATA bus is a great way to get around. AAATA TheRide operates 27 bus routes and several Park & Ride Lots in the Ann Arbor-Ypsilanti area.
