



General Packaging Instructions

Packaging your household hazardous waste correctly keeps you and our staff safe. It also helps our staff efficiently sort your waste.

1) Bring items in original containers if possible.



If an item does not have a label or is not in the original container, write a brief description of the item on the container using a permanent marker. Do not bring items in glass bottles or jars unless it is the original container.

Containers that are larger than 6 gallons will be rejected because they are too large for our staff.

2) Place items in plastic totes or cardboard boxes.

Placing your waste in plastic totes or cardboard boxes helps contain spills and prevents hazardous chemicals from leaking into your vehicle.



3) Put all waste in the trunk or bed of your vehicle.



Putting your waste in the back of your vehicle keeps any hazardous chemical spills away from you or your passengers.

Wedge upright propane tanks between the front and back seat and do not place them in the trunk.
