- Federal Emergency Broadband Benefit Program
NOTE: This program is new and will be up and running by May 1, 2021
Apply through your existing ISP (internet service provider) or directly with the Universal Service Administration Company <https://www.usac.org/lifeline/get-started/>

This program provides a benefit of up to \$50 a month for broadband service and up to \$75 a month for Tribal area residents. Eligible households can also get a one-time discount of up to \$100 for a computer or tablet.

- You are eligible if...
 - You qualify for the existing Lifeline program
 - You receive benefits under a free and reduced-price school lunch program or school breakfast program.
 - You lost your job or experienced a substantial loss of income since Feb. 29, 2020.
 - You're a student who receives a Federal Pell Grant.
 - You meet the eligibility criteria for your participating internet provider's existing low-income or COVID-19 program.
