

Rules of Rain Gardens:

- 1. The rain garden should be 10' away from any basement.
- 2. Water should pool 3"-6" deep no deeper.
- 3. The bottom of the rain garden, where water pools, should be flat.
- 4. When the rain garden overflows, overflow to a safe location not toward the house!
- 5. The soil in the rain garden should be the existing topsoil, mixed with compost.
- 6. Mulch the rain garden like any perennial bed.

Digging on a Slope:



- 1. Put up the stakes and the string with the line level. Make the string level.
- 2. Start digging at the top, where it says "cut".
- 3. Pile the soil where the berm will be.
- 4. Keep digging until the bottom of the rain garden is 3"-6" below the top of the berm, and is level (Note: dig 6"-9" if you are adding 3" of compost). Measure from the string to the ground.
- 5. Pick one part of the berm as an "emergency overflow"; reinforce with stones (This sets the depth of water).
- 6. Dig a little more to "feather" the edges so they aren't so steep. Put extra soil on the berm, making sure emergency overflow is the lowest part of the berm.
- 7. Add compost. Till. Add mulch.
