

SafeHouse Center Services

All of our services are confidential and free of charge.

Helpline: 734-995-5444 Survivors of domestic abuse or sexual assault, their friends, family and other concerned people can call our 24 hour HelpLine to talk, get information and resources, or learn more about our services. *You do not need to be in crisis to call us. *If you don't speak English, say the name of your preferred language in English (example: "Arabic") and wait a moment. The helpline worker will return to the line in a few moments with an interpreter.*

Emergency Shelter We provide emergency shelter for survivors and their children in a safe, welcoming, temporary home, where they take steps to reclaim independence and security. Families and individuals spending time at Shelter have their own bedrooms and share a large living room, kitchen, and dining area. Children attend public school and have the use of a beautiful play room and secure outdoor activity area. Meals and healthcare services are provided. If you need shelter, or know someone who does, call our HelpLine.

Medical Care SafeHouse Center has a clinic on site that is staffed by a Nurse Practitioner. Any survivor of sexual assault or domestic violence, or their children, can access general practice care through this clinic. For more information, call the 24-hour HelpLine.

Support Groups SafeHouse Center currently offers free virtual support groups for survivors of domestic violence and sexual assault in which survivors can talk to others who have similar experiences. Legal Advocacy SafeHouse Center advocates help survivors obtain Personal Protection Orders and understand legal requirements, procedures and services. Our legal advocates will also accompany survivors to legal hearings.

Crisis Support and Advocacy SafeHouse Center provides short term (up to 6 months) of crisis intervention services both immediately after crisis events and on-going. Advocates can make referrals for additional help or therapy to adults and children. Advocates can provide emotional support, healing, safety-planning and advocacy.

On-Call Services (Response Team) Our Response Team provides immediate response to survivors of domestic violence and sexual assault 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. Trained Response Team volunteers and advocates respond to reports from Washtenaw County police, hospitals and jail, and make immediate contact with survivors in person or by phone to listen, give information and provide support.
