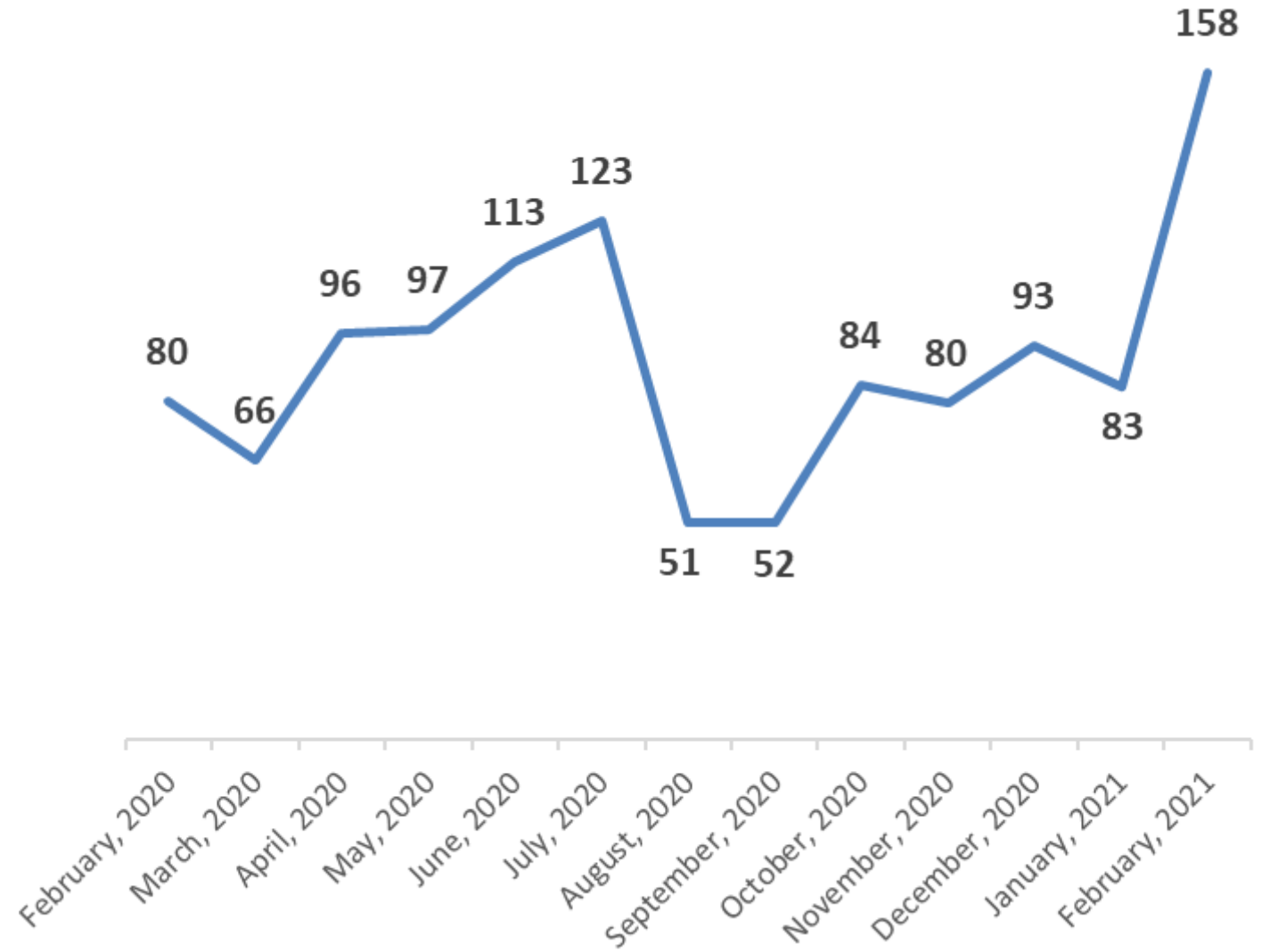


Veteran By Name List: 3 Month Lookback

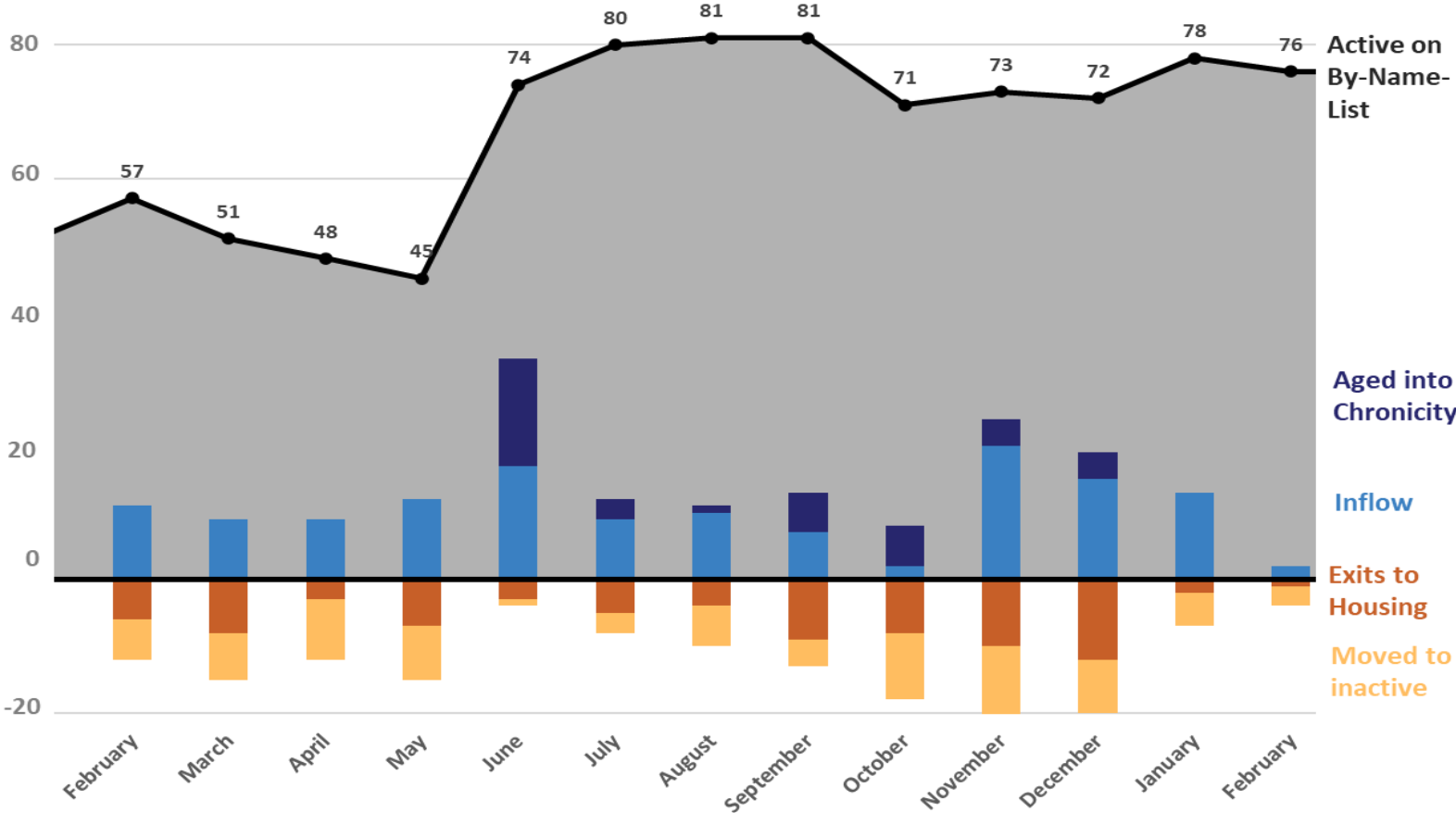

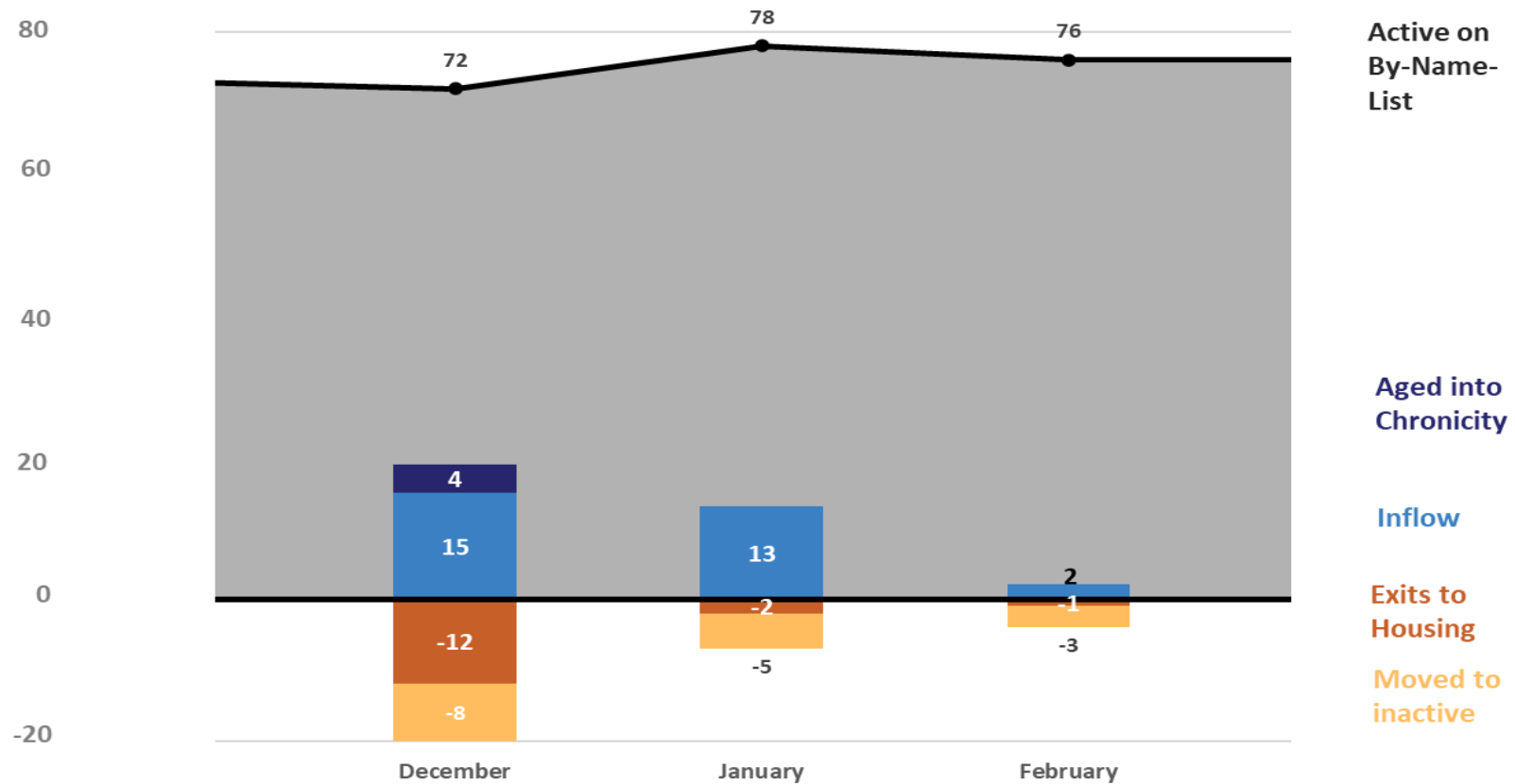
Average Length of Time to Housing, in

Chronic By Name List: Year Lookback

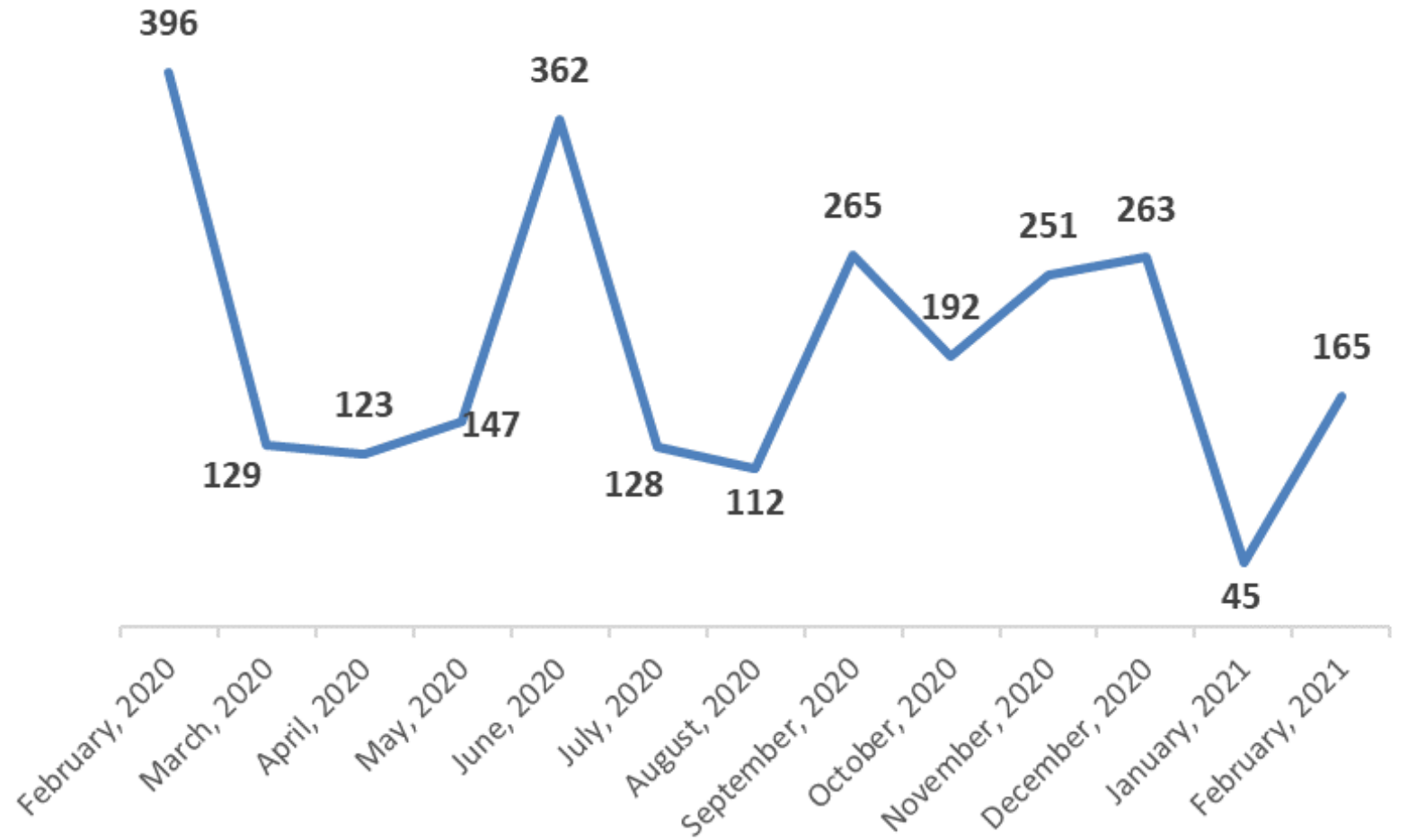


Chronic By Name List: 3 Month Lookback

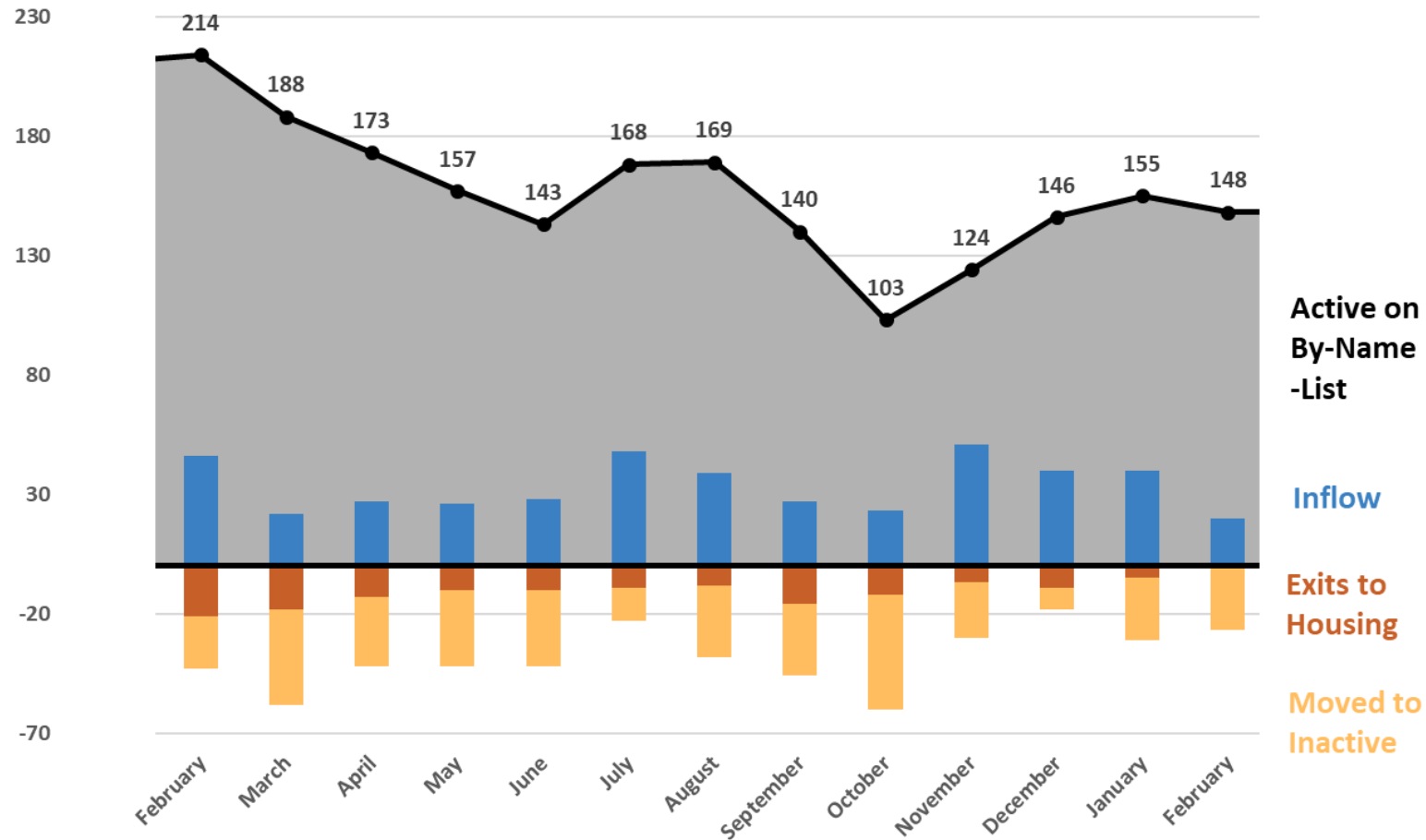

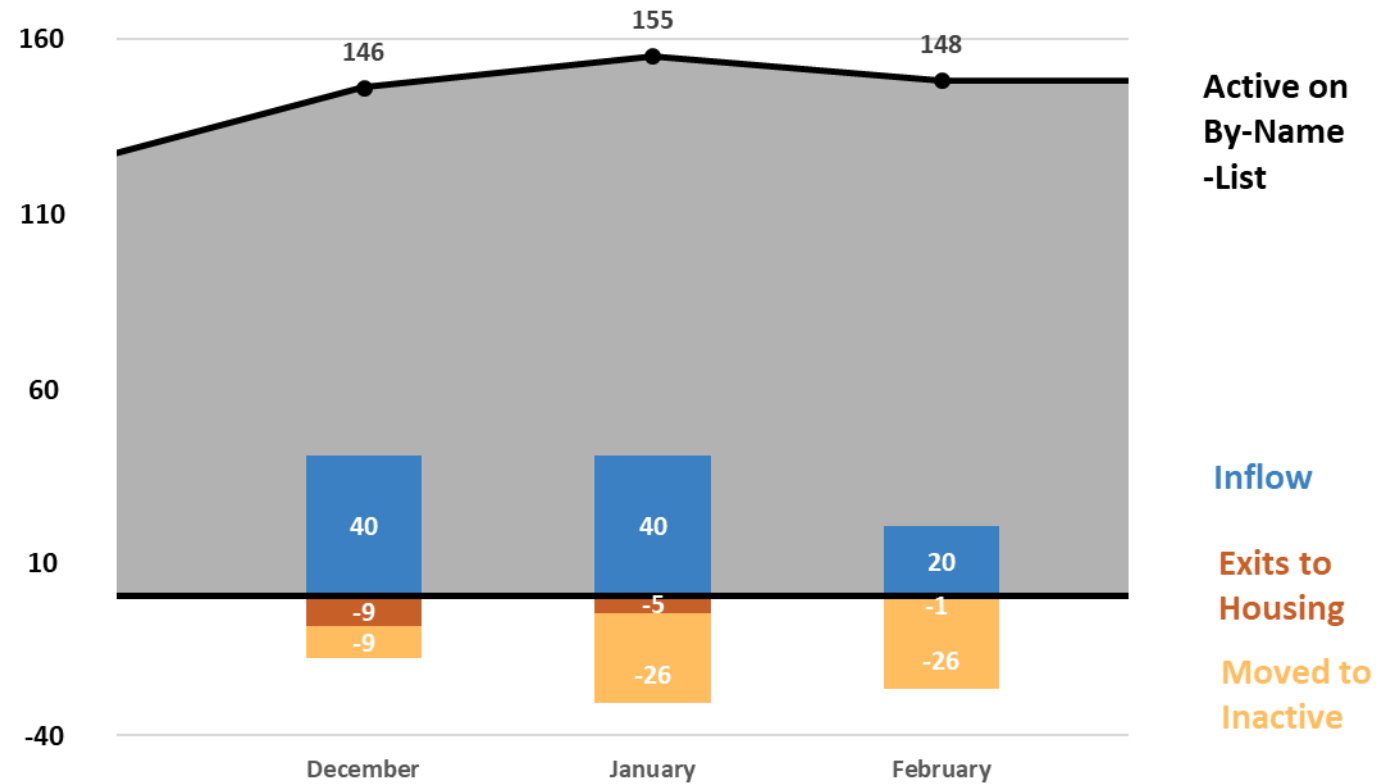

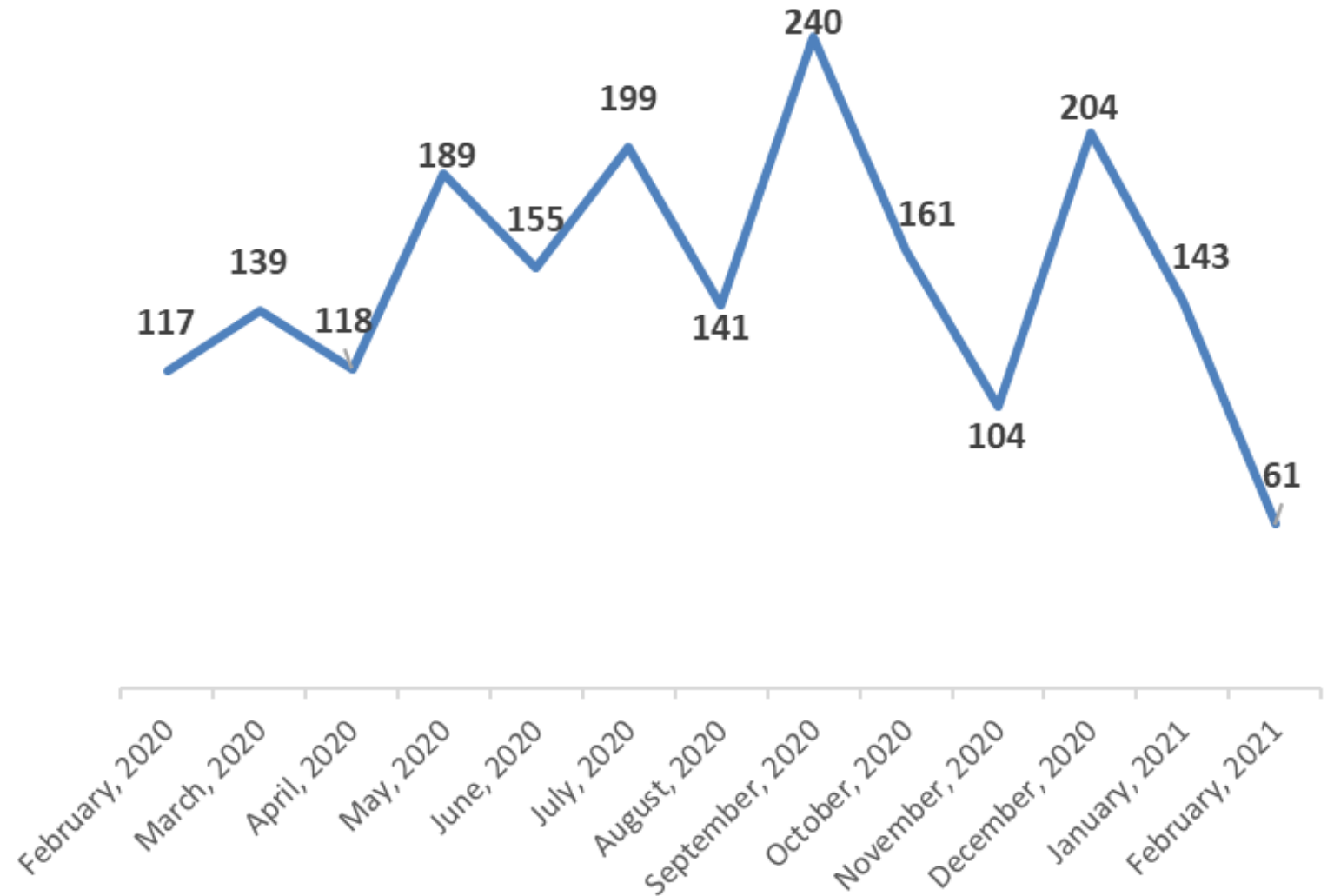


Non-Chronic By Name List: 3 Month Lookback

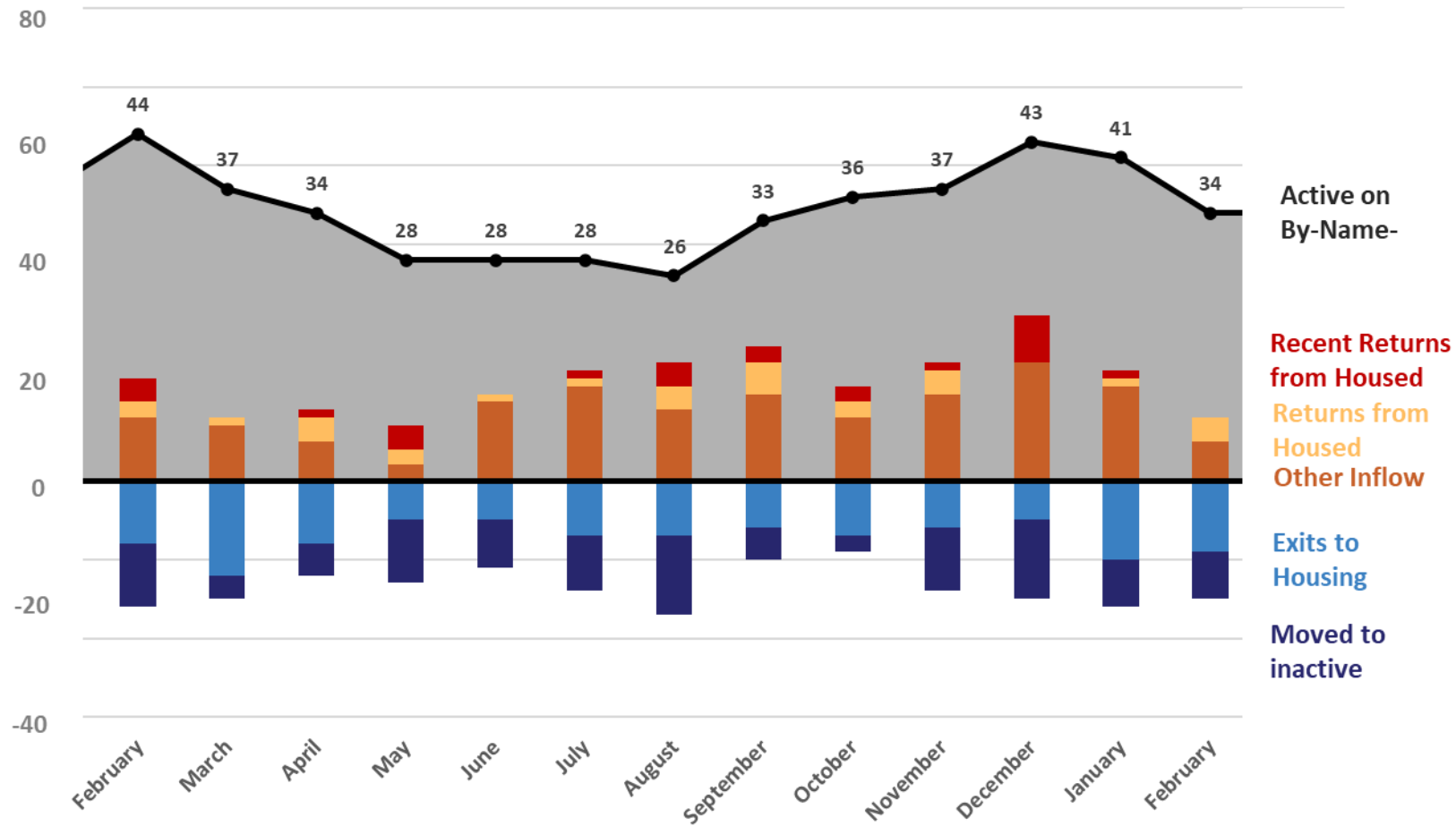

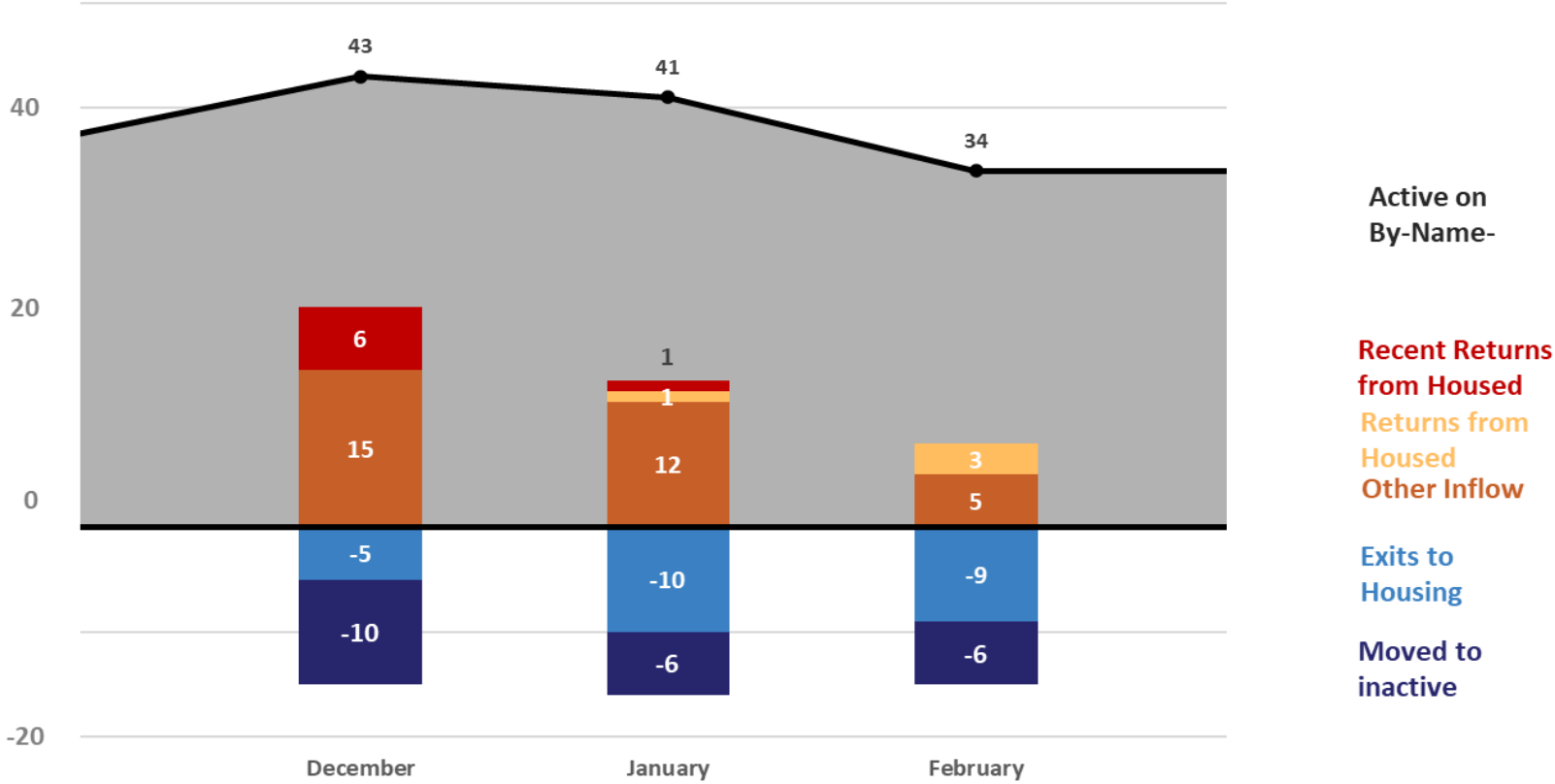

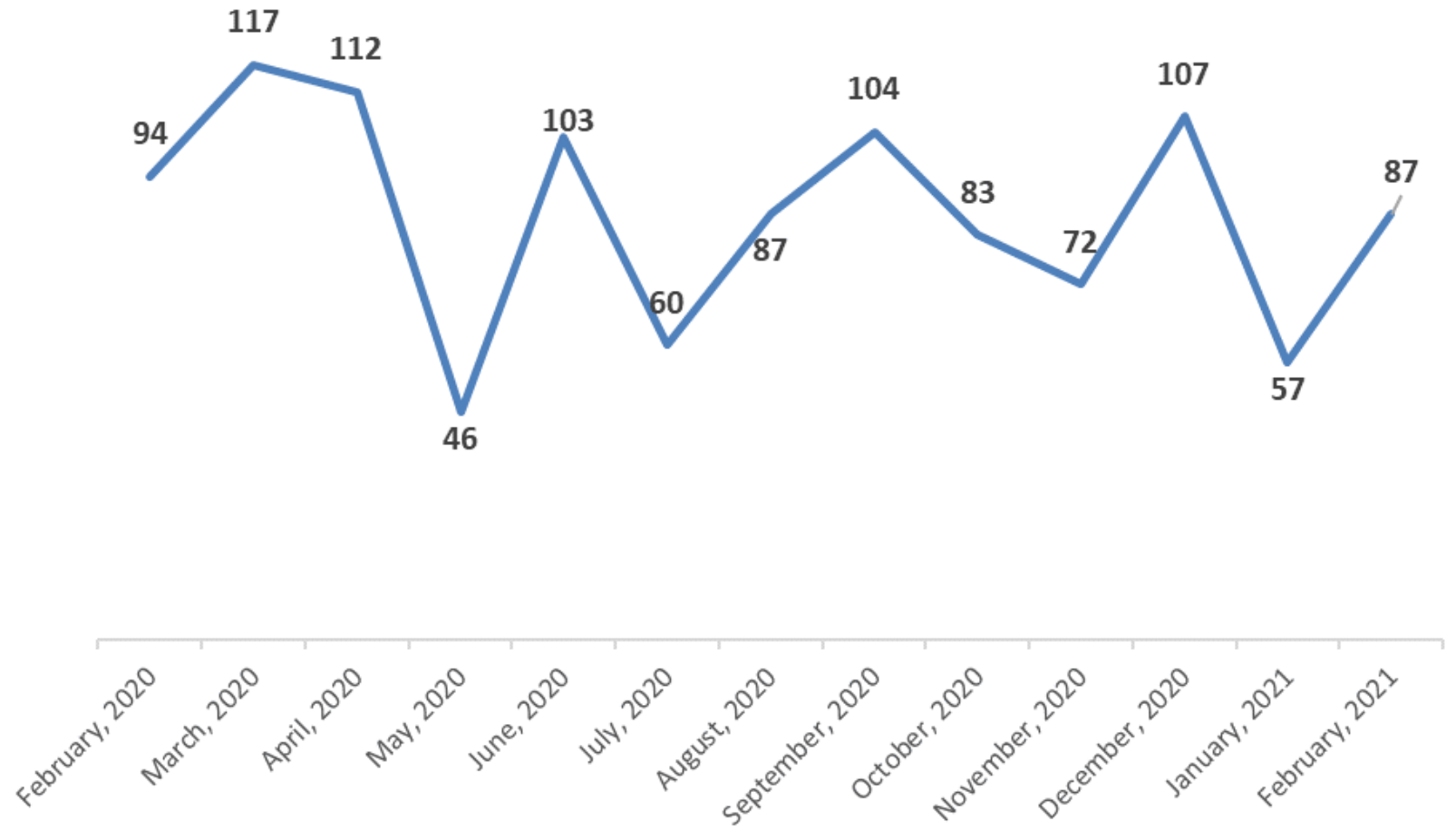

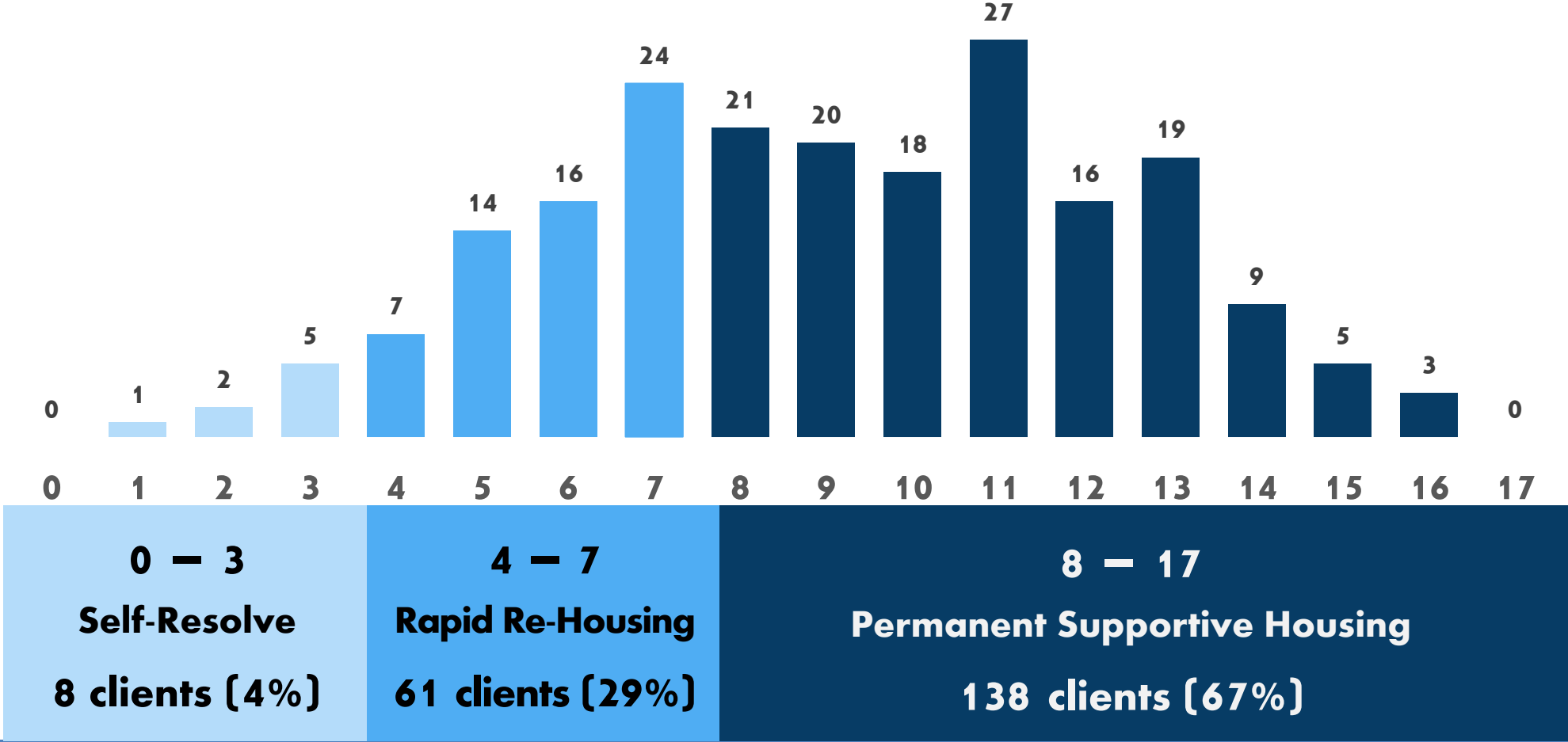

Individual VI-SPDAT Scores: All 2020



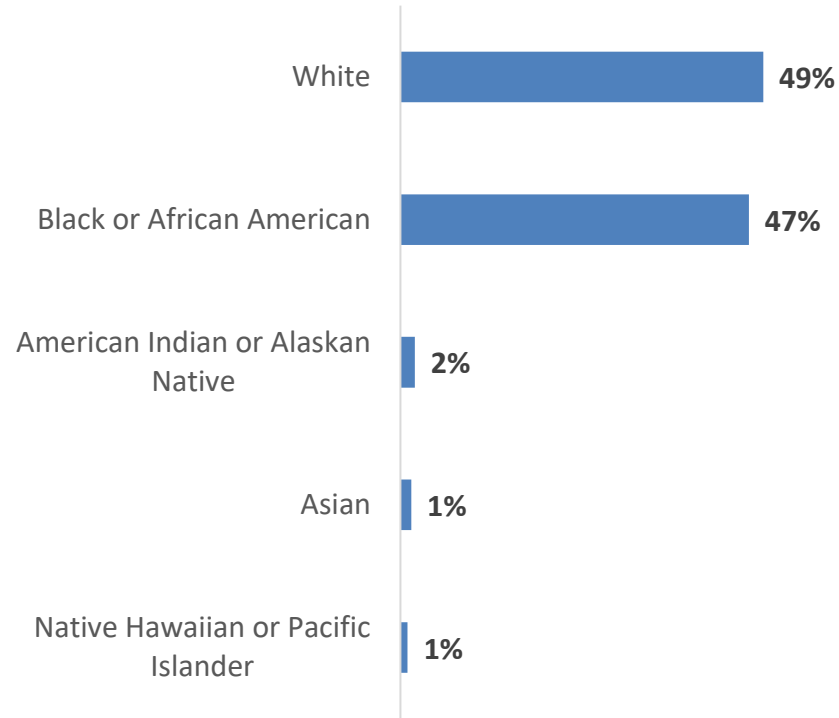
Individual VI-SPDAT Scores: December through February '21



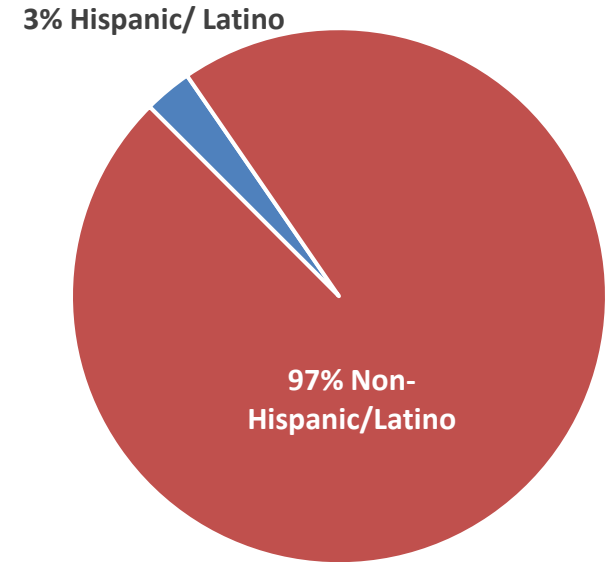

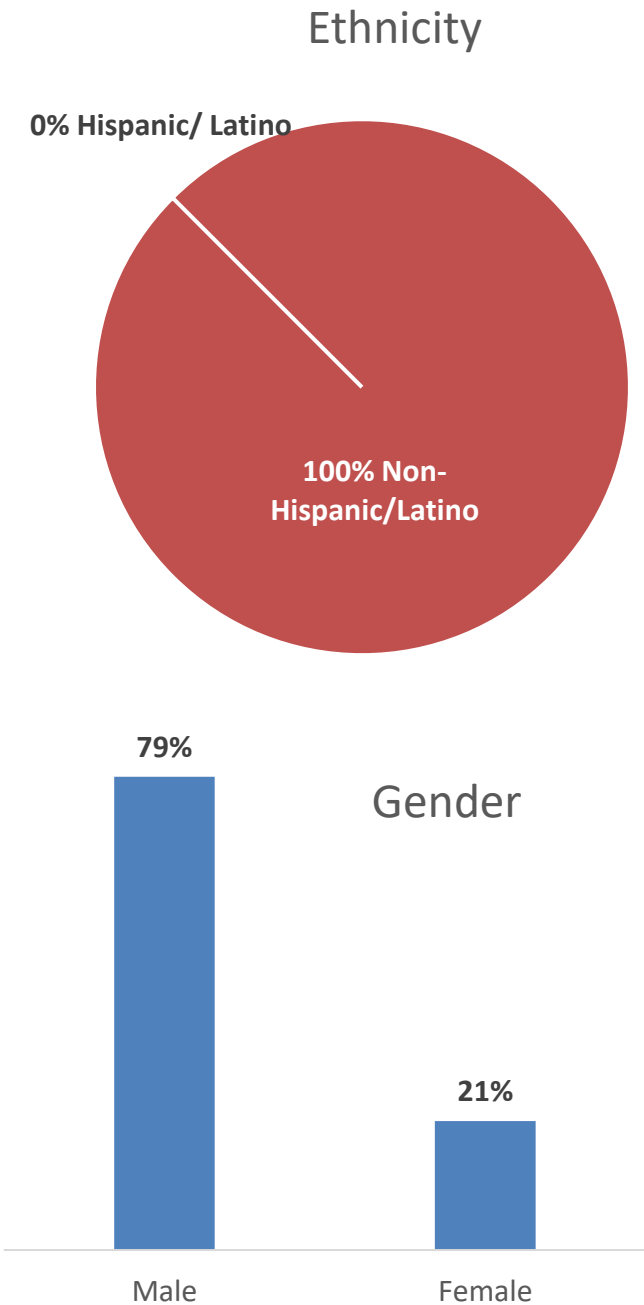
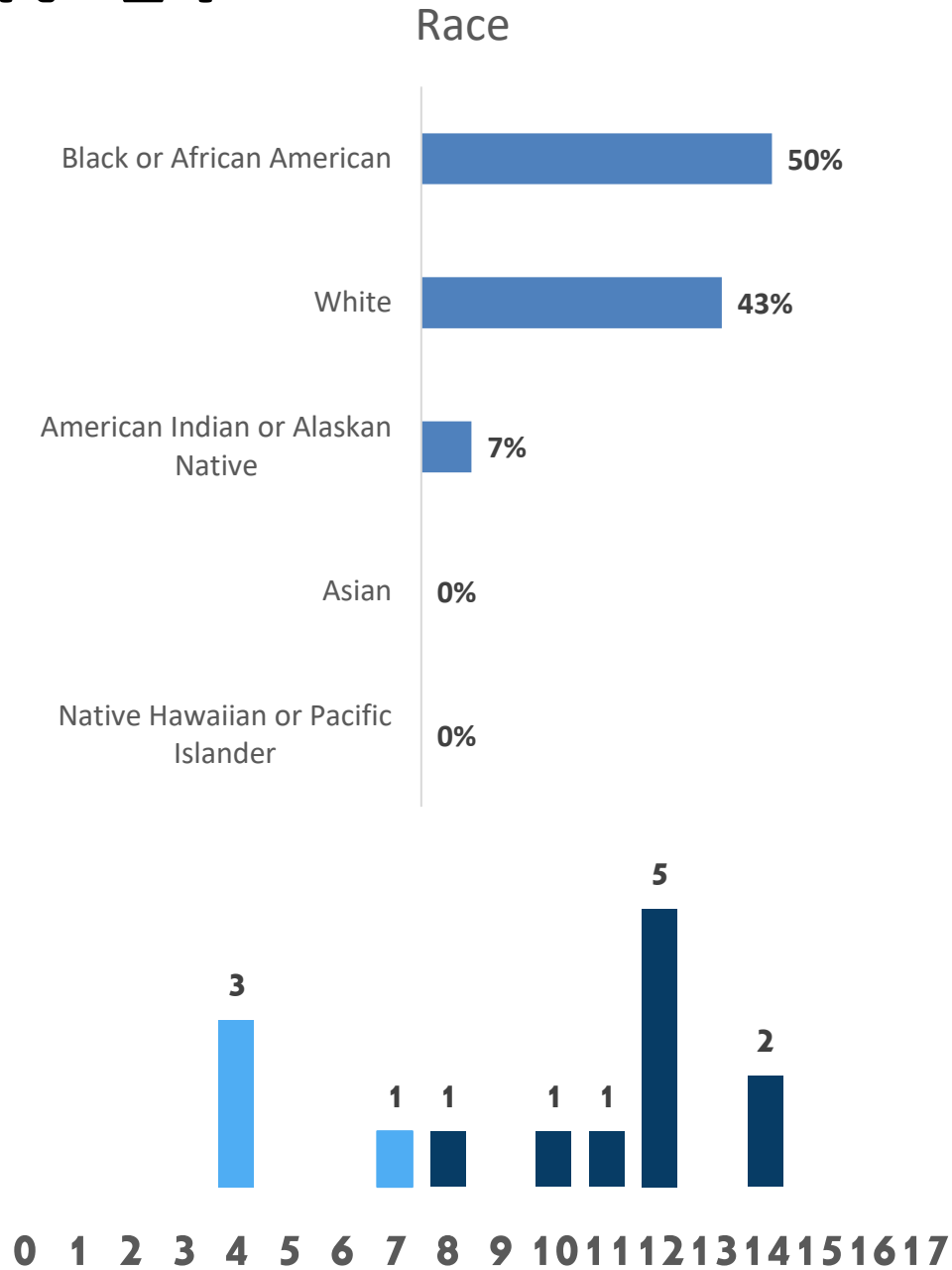
Veteran Exits To Housing

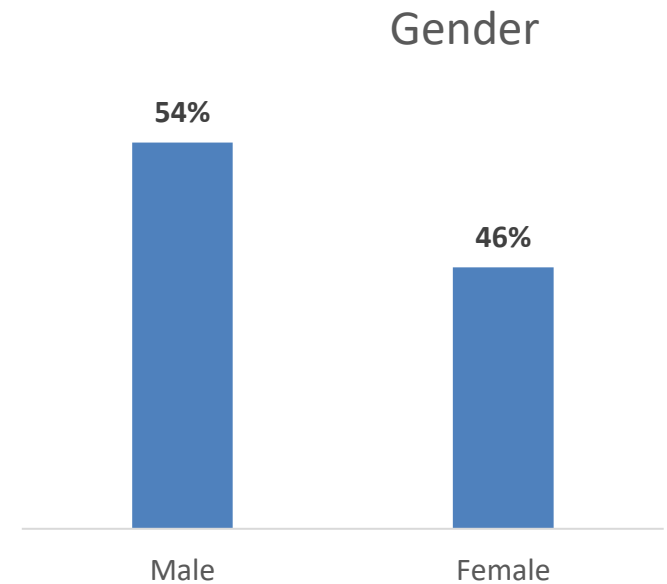
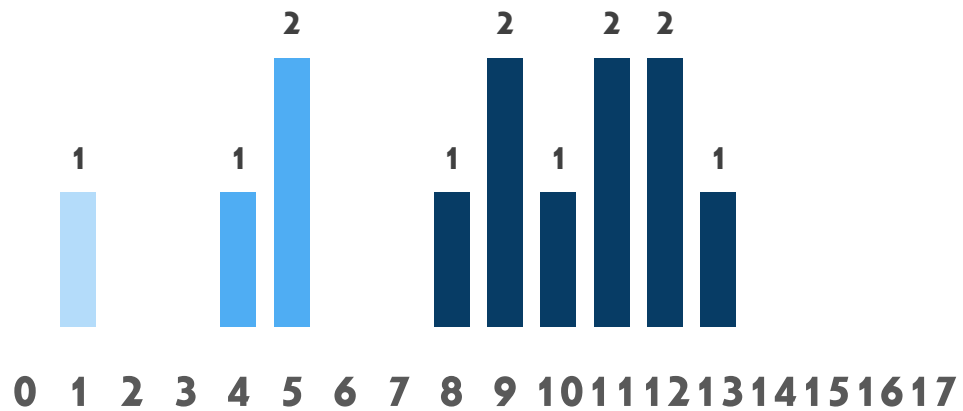
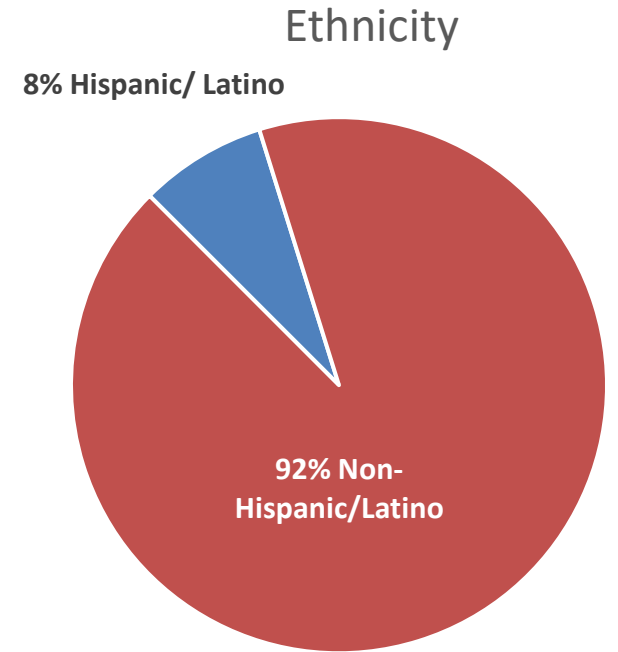
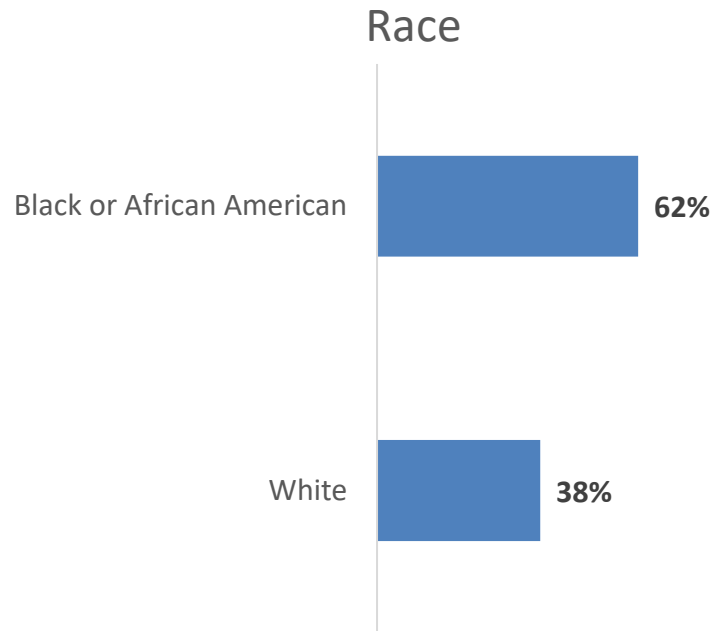
Chronic Exits To Housing

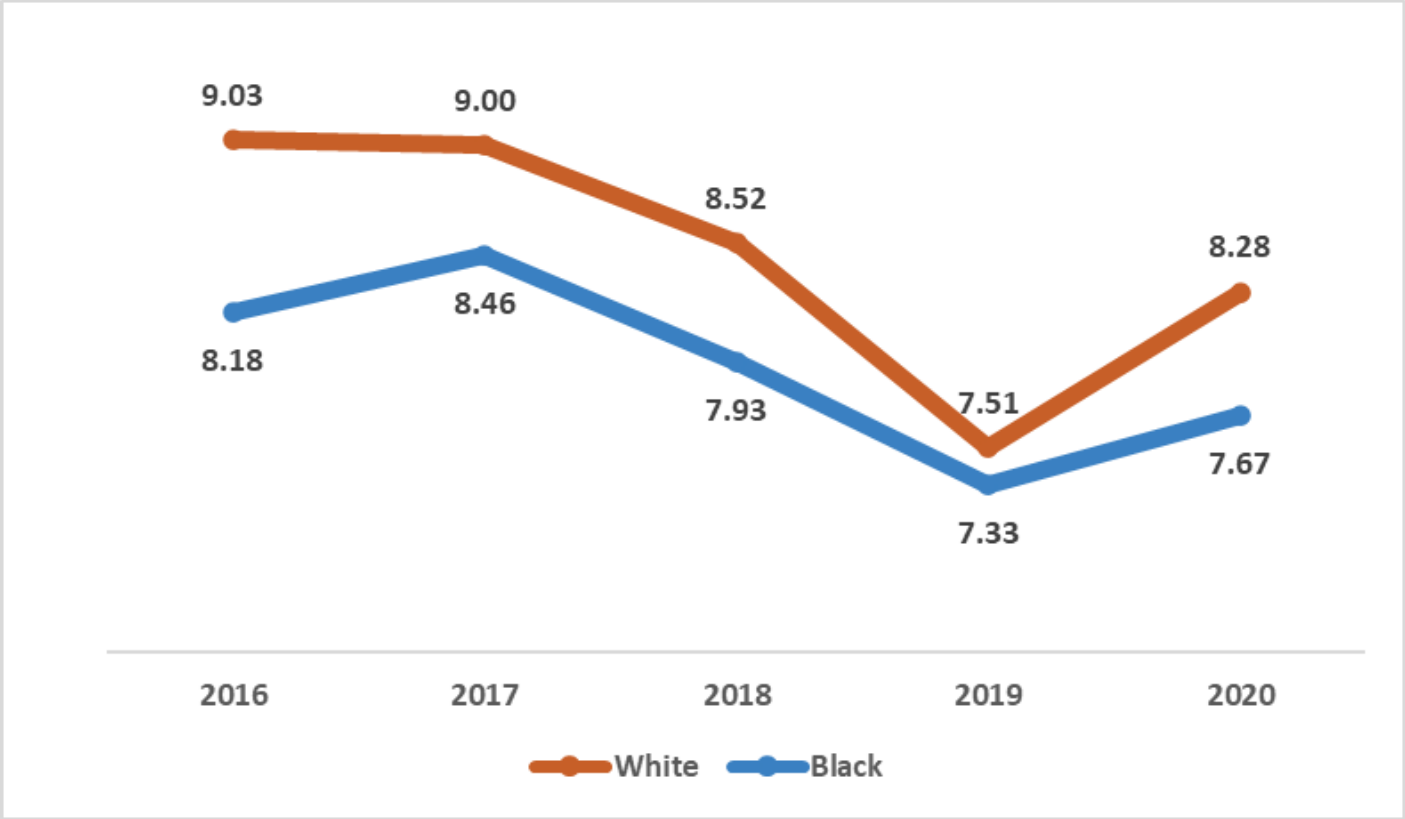


Non-Chronic Exits To Housing

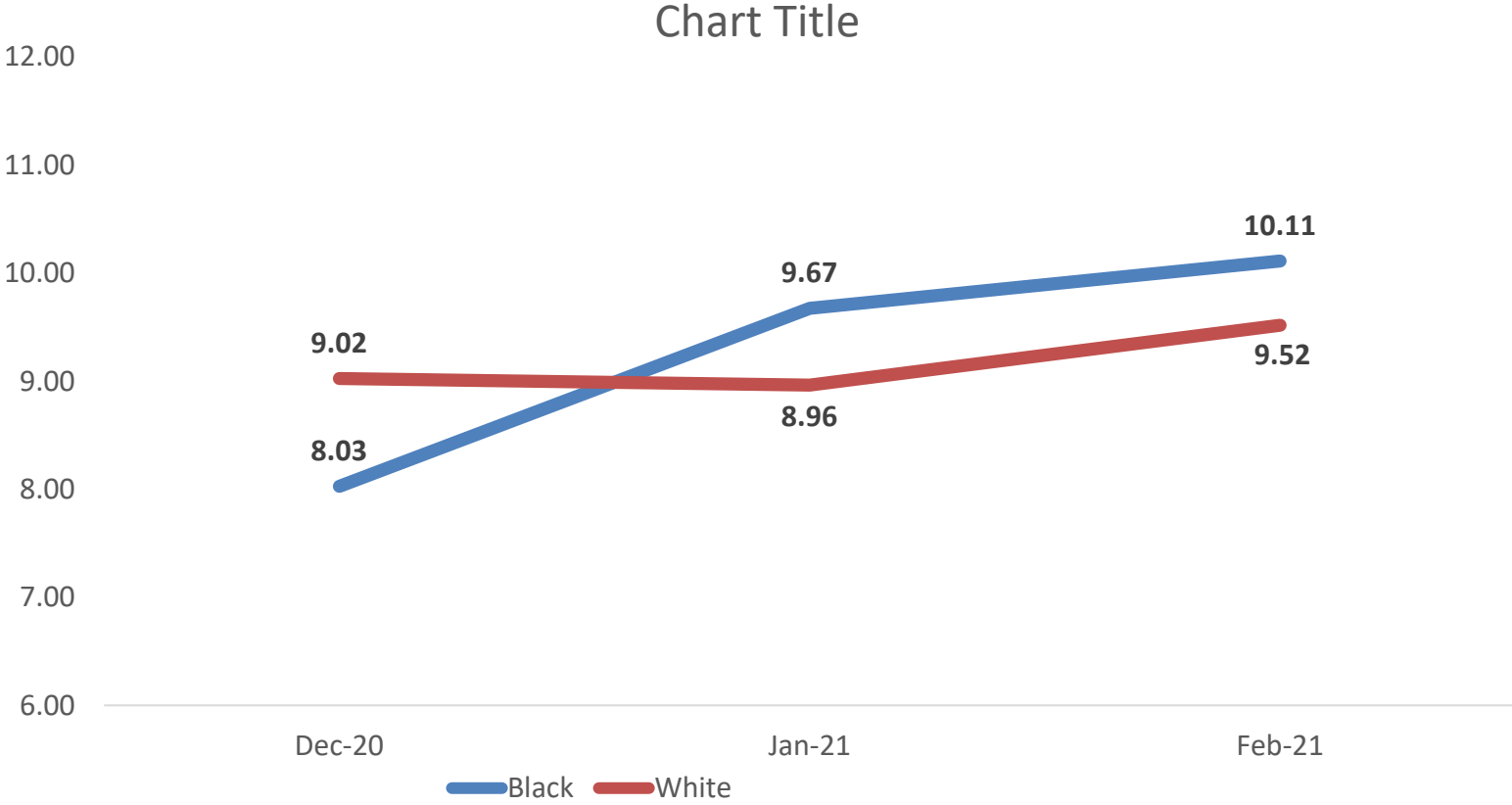


VI-SPDAT Scores: Racial Disparity Over Time



Average yearly scores, by race. There is a clear bias towards higher scores for white persons, with an average difference of .5 points. Since this assessment contributes to the prioritization of limited housing resources, lower scores for Black persons may indicate a systemic access issue.

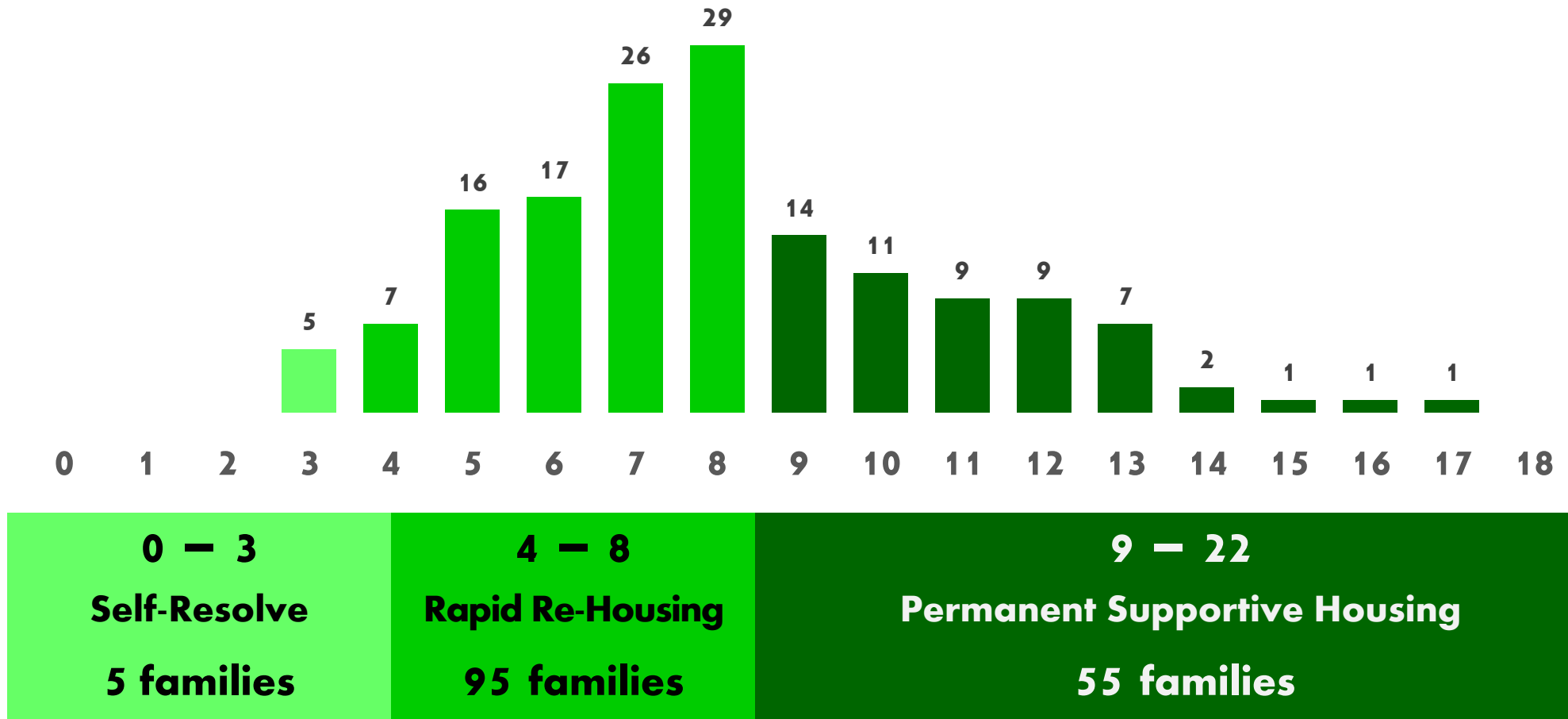
VI-SPDAT Scores: Racial Disparity December to February



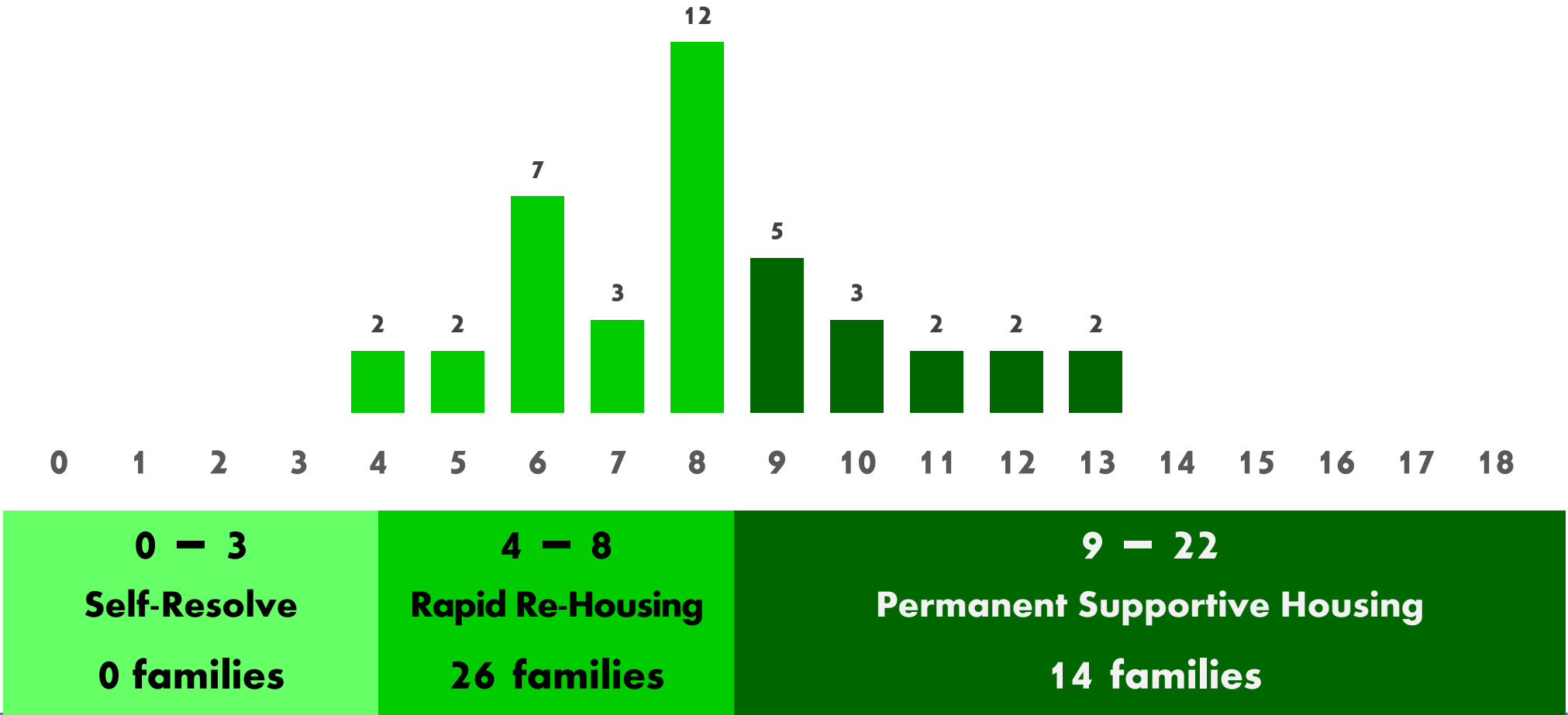
The racial disparity may not be observed each month but has been consistent over longer periods of time.

Family VI-F-SPDAT Scores: All 2020



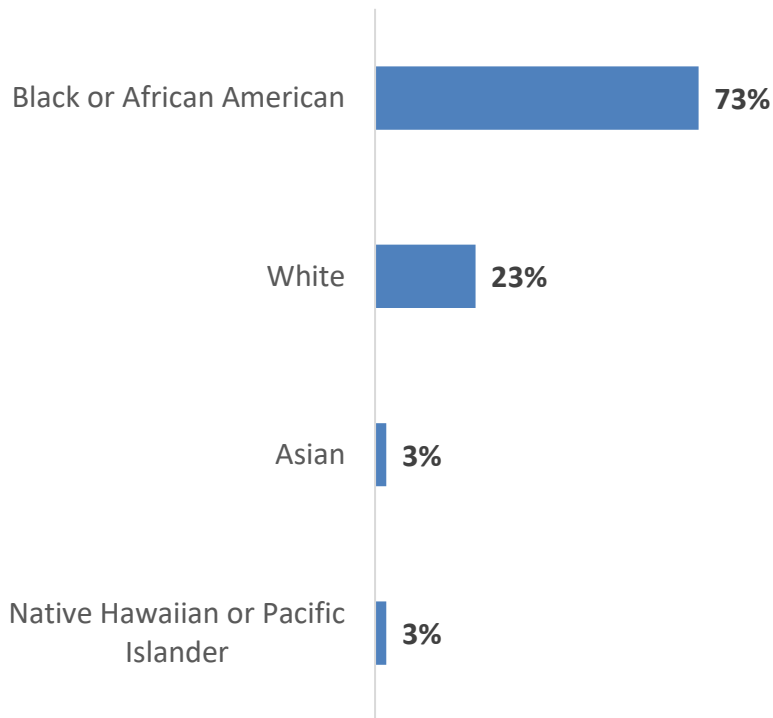
Family VI-F-SPDAT Scores: December 2020 through February 2021



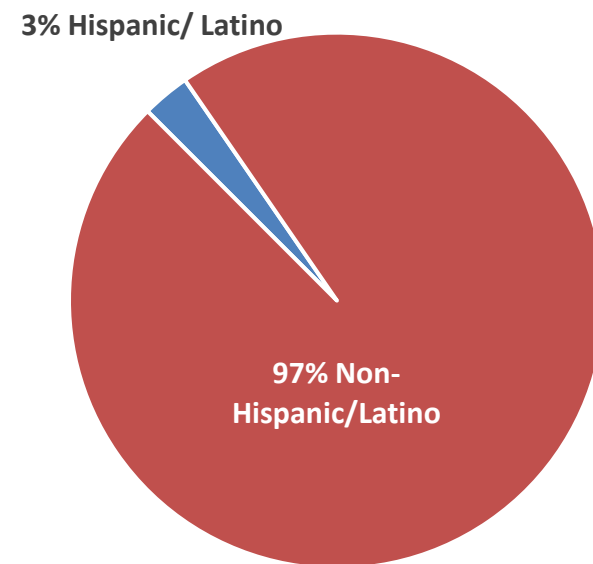

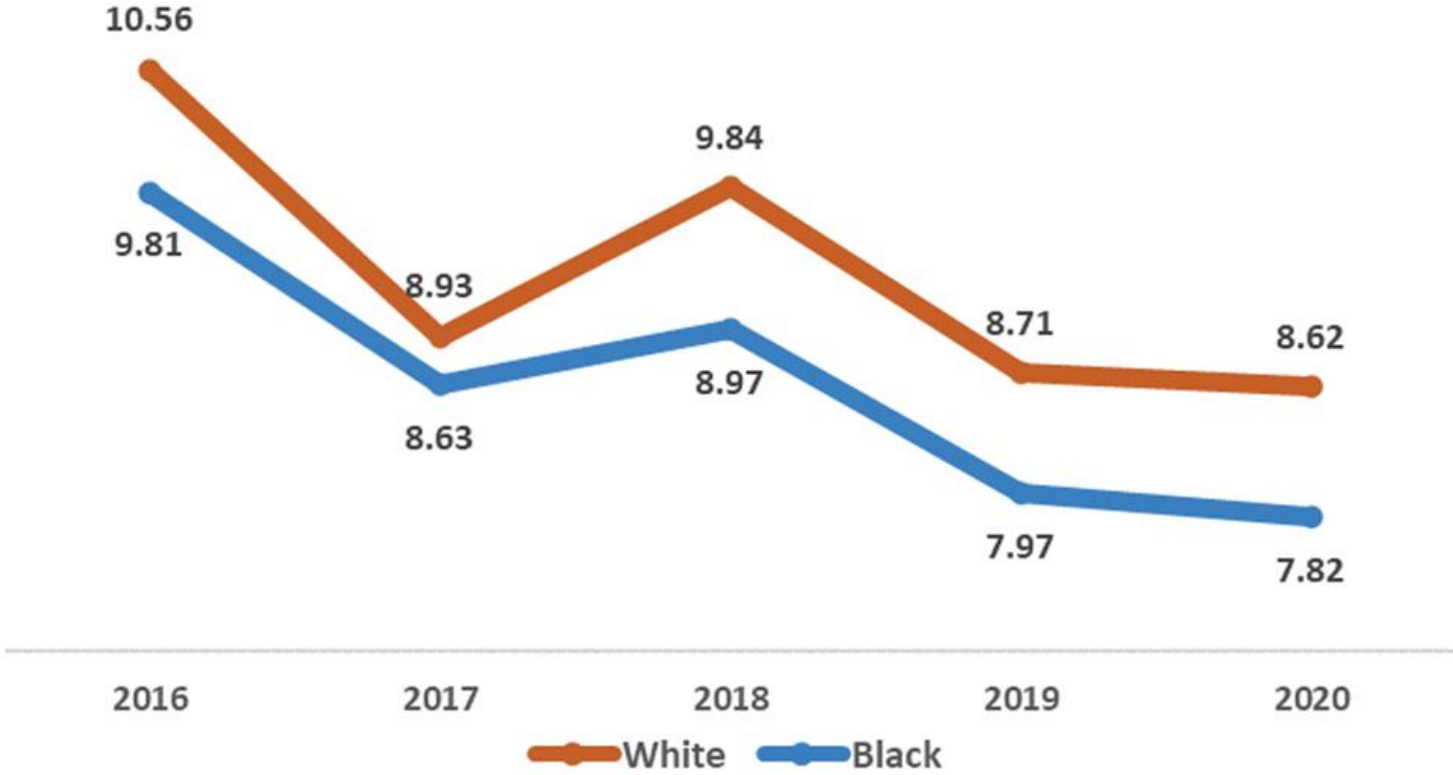


Family Head of Household Exits To Housing

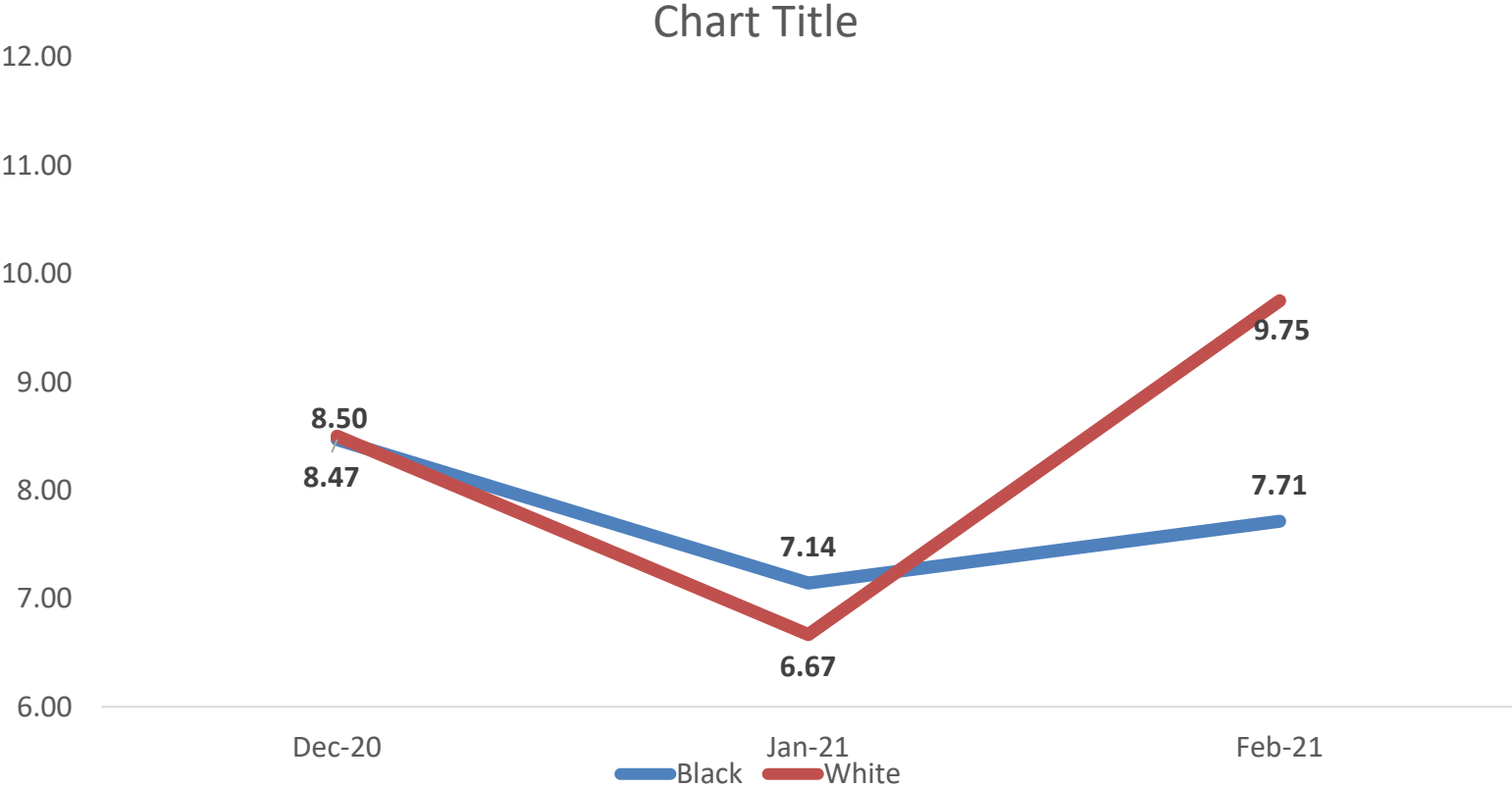
VI-SPDAT Scores: Racial Disparity Over Time



The average yearly family score, by race. As with individuals, there is a clear and consistent trend of higher scores for households with white heads of household.

The gap at the end of 2020 was .8 points.
