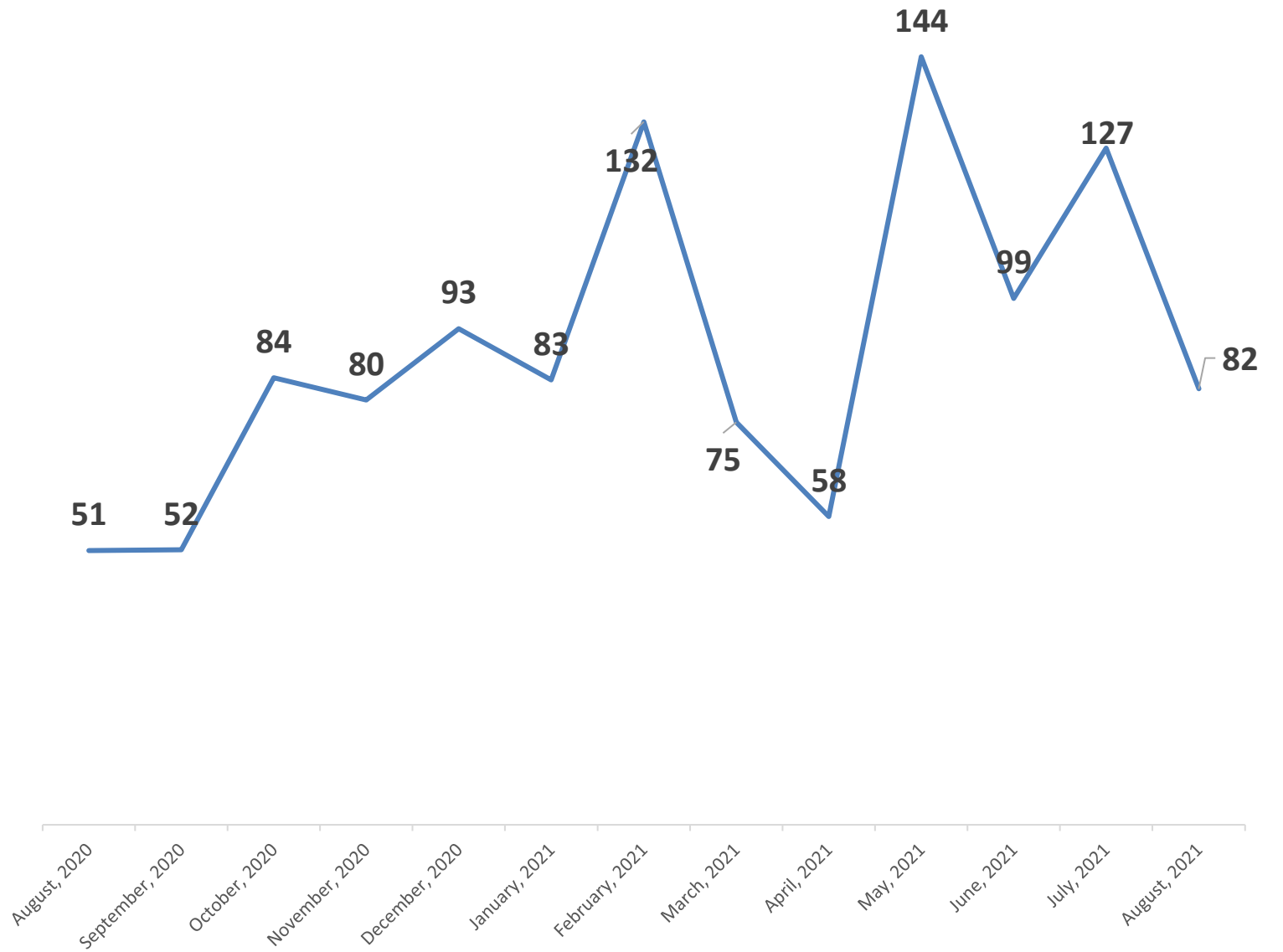


Veteran By Name List: 3 Month Lookback

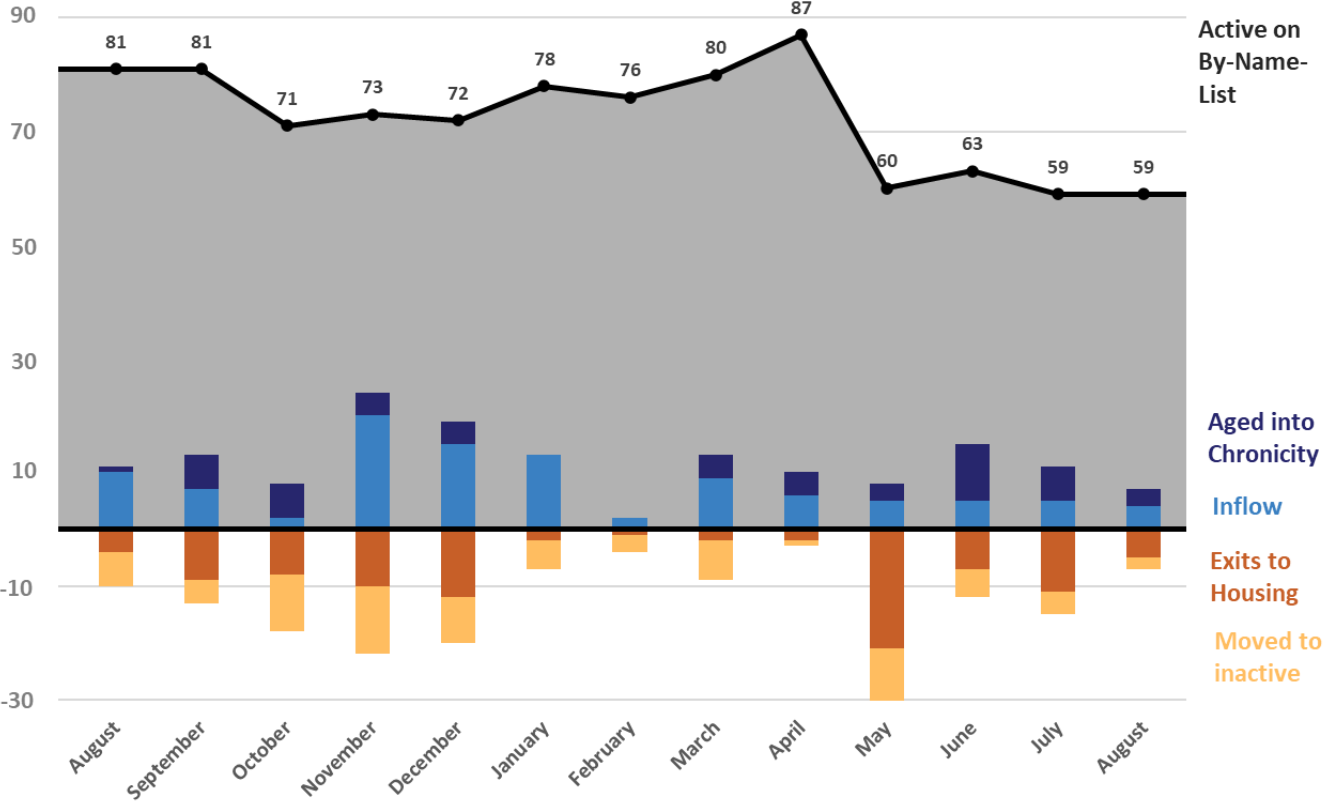

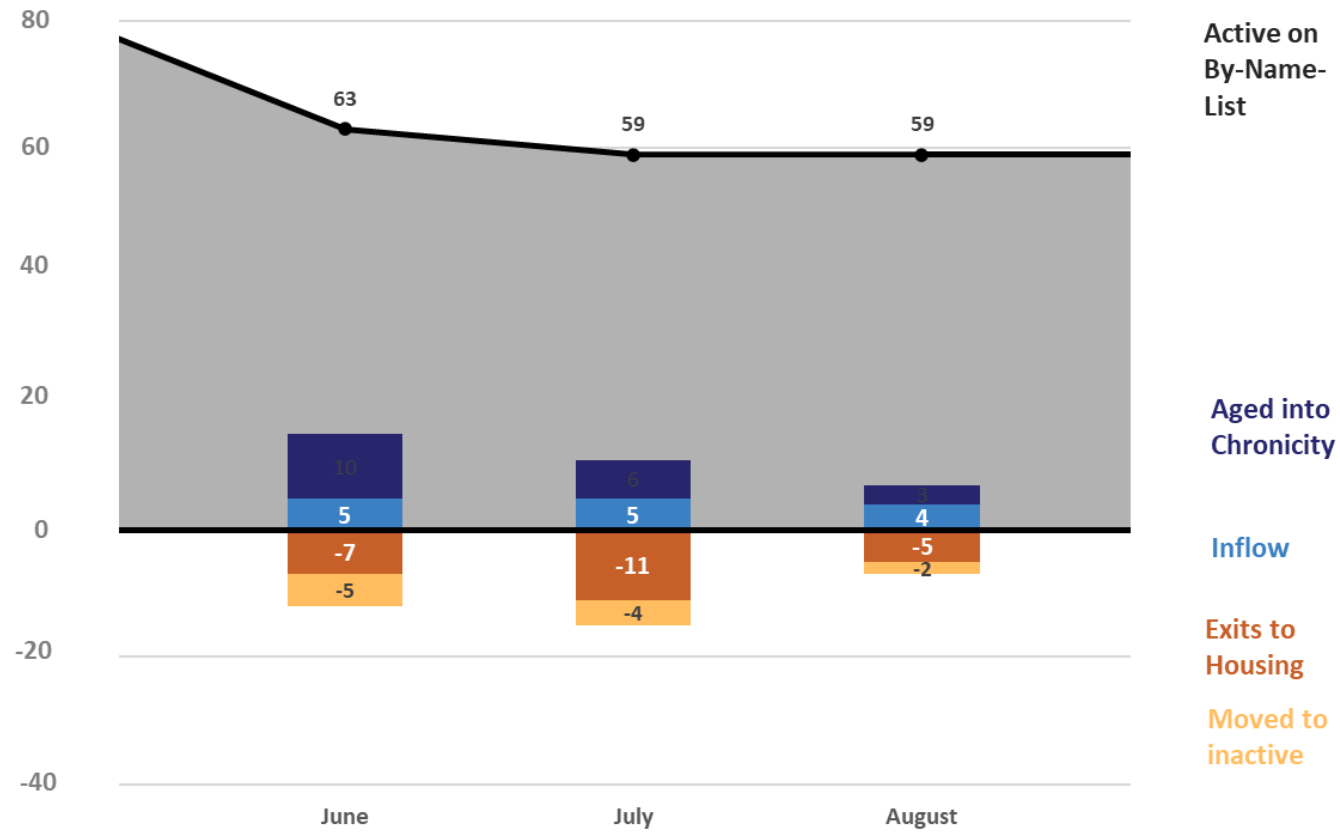
Average Length of Time to Housing, in

Chronic By Name List: Year Lookback

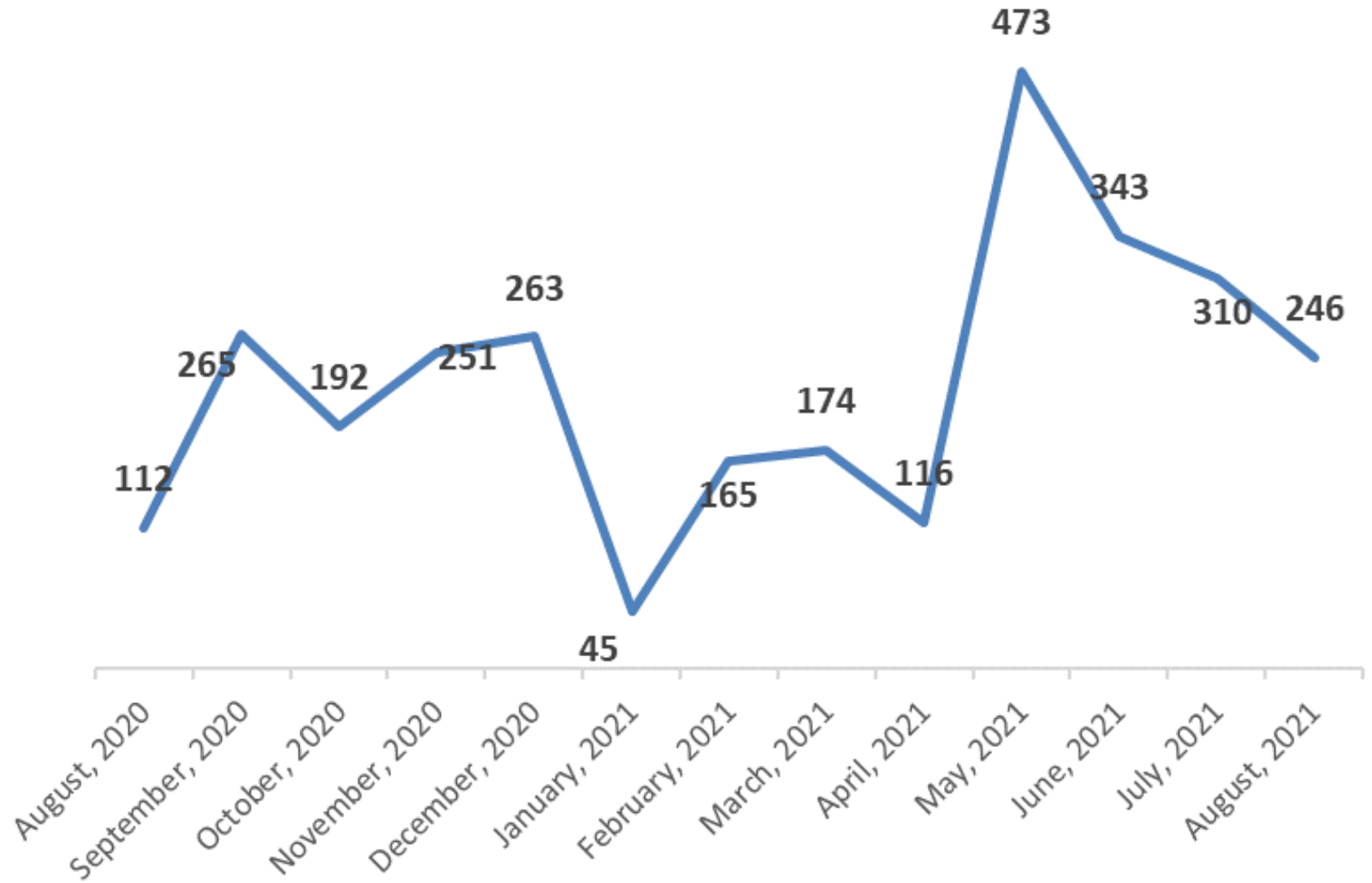

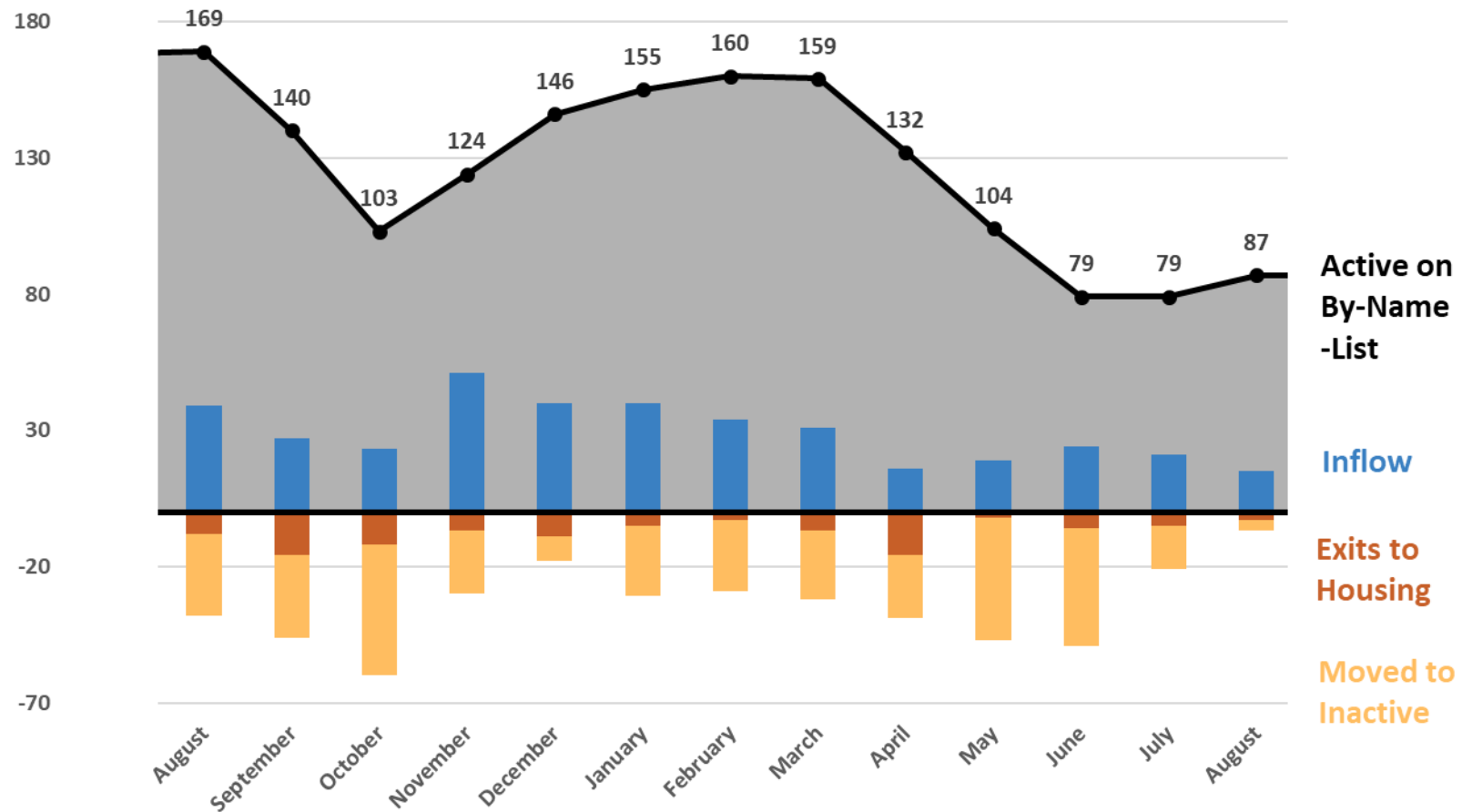

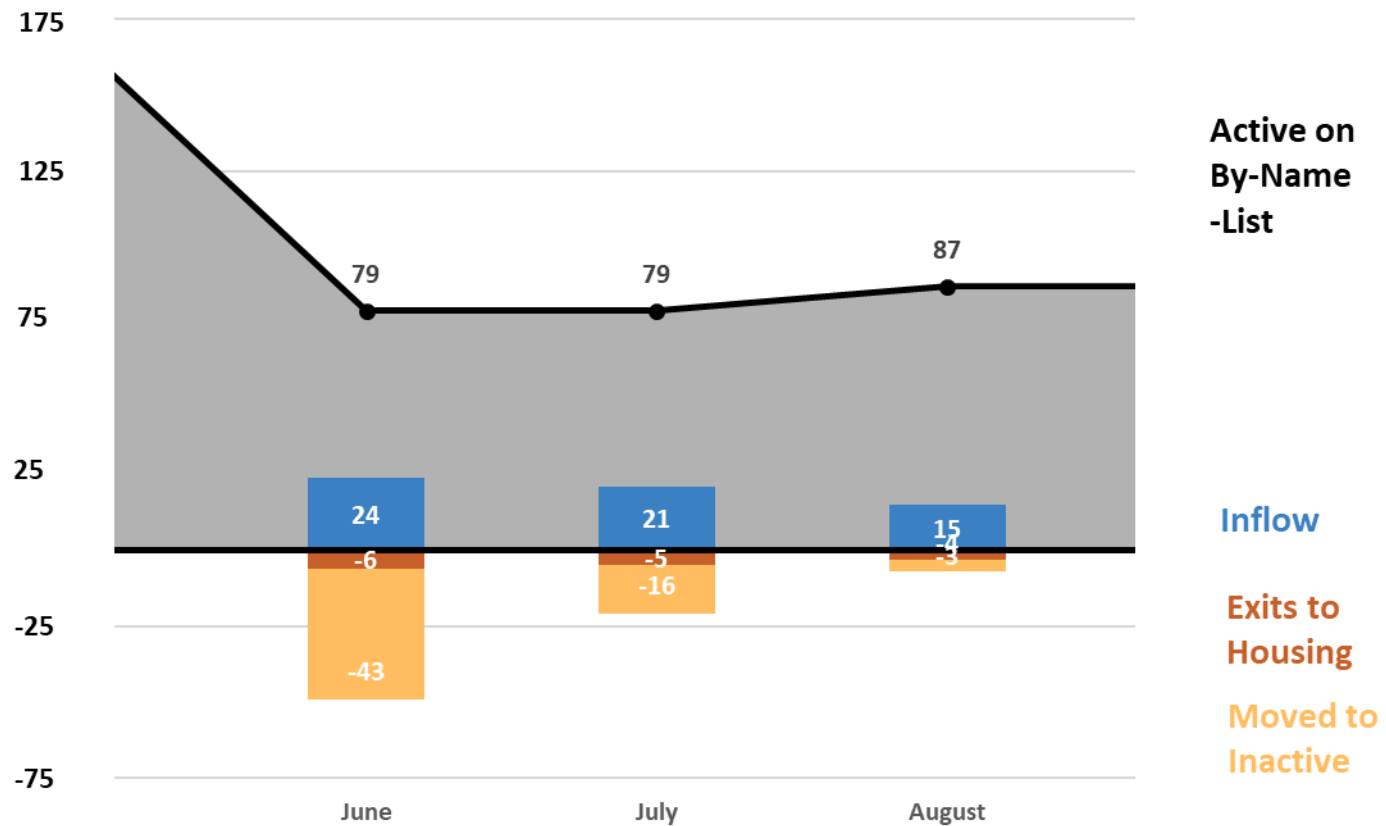

Non-Chronic By Name List: Year Lookback

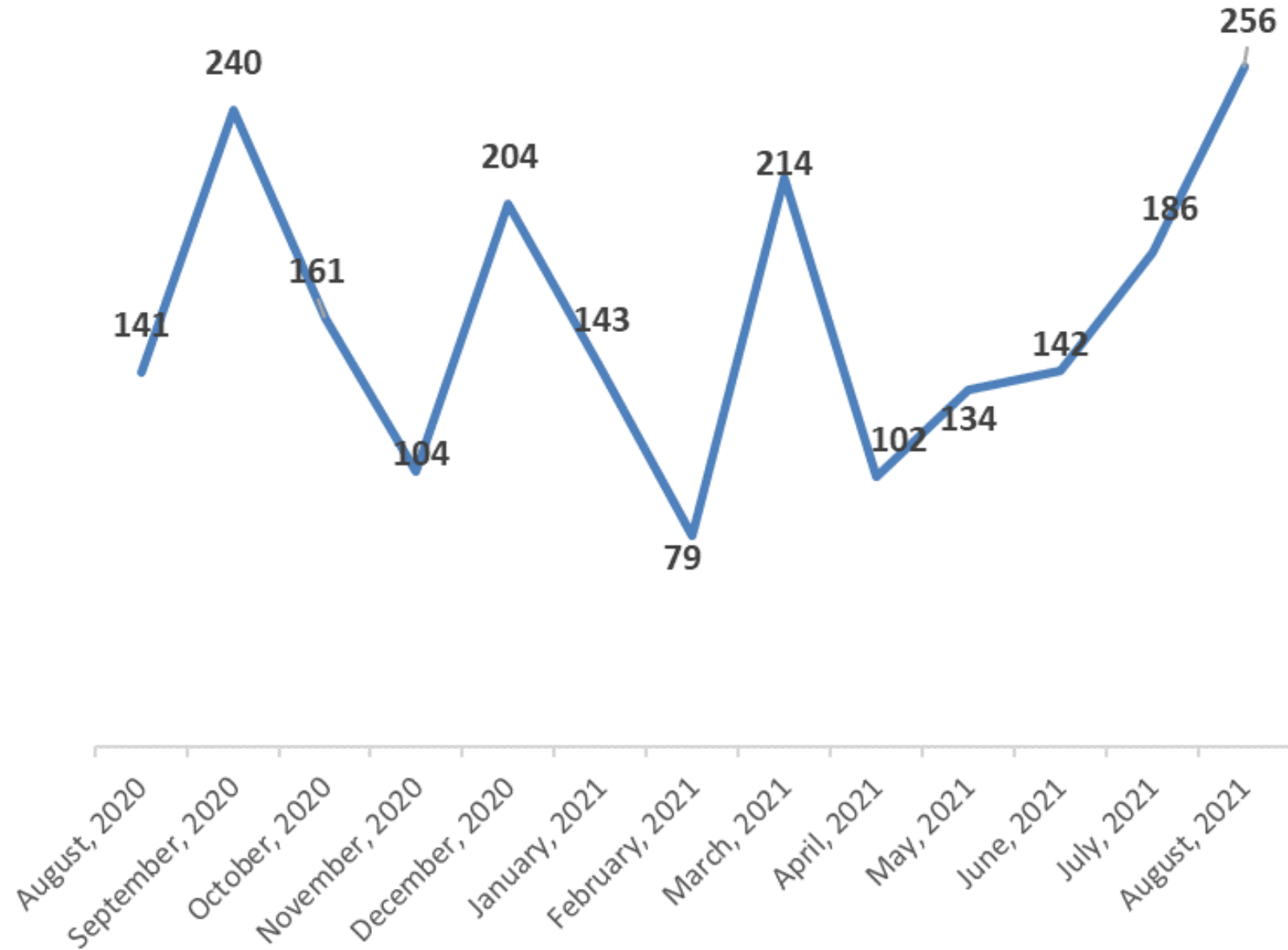

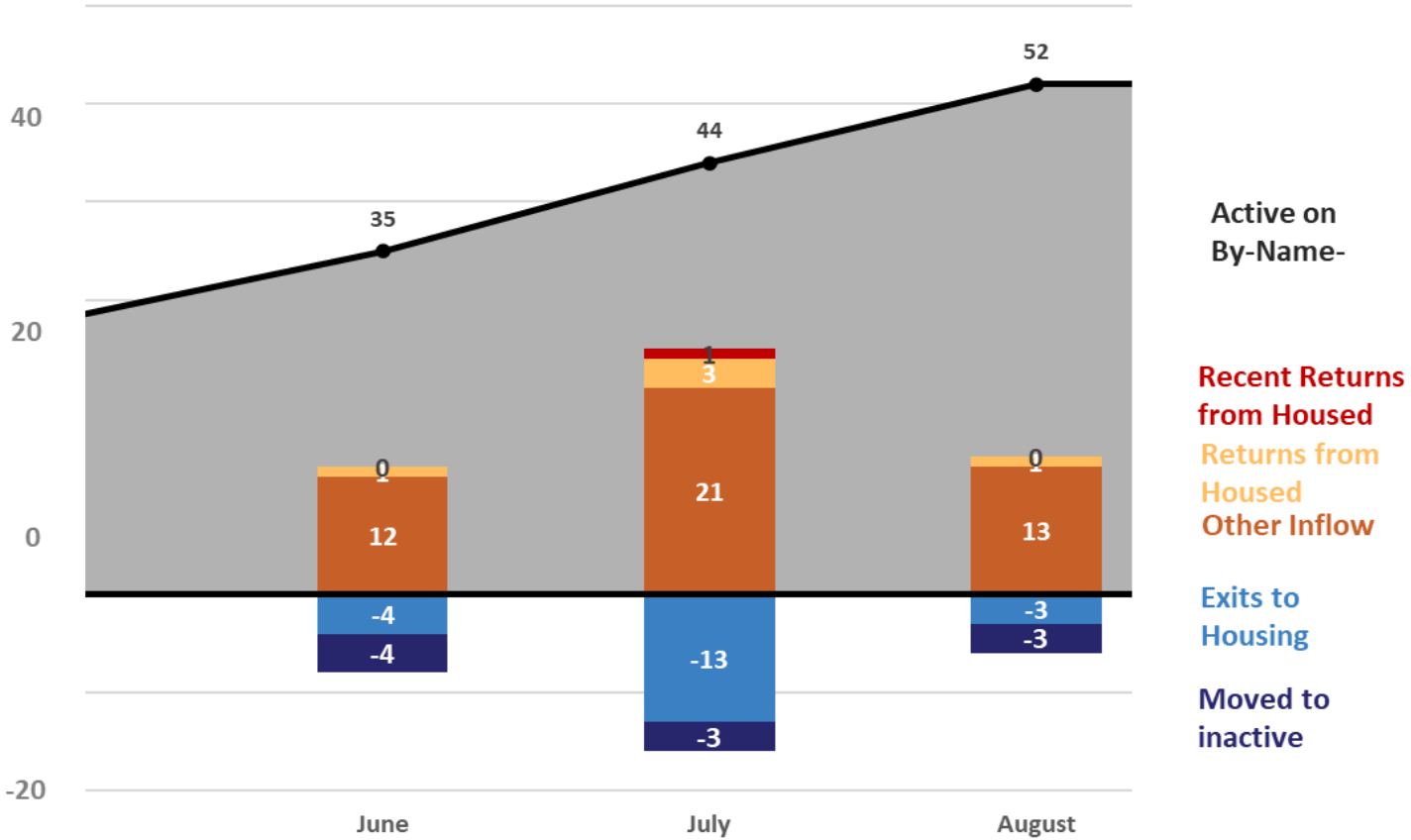

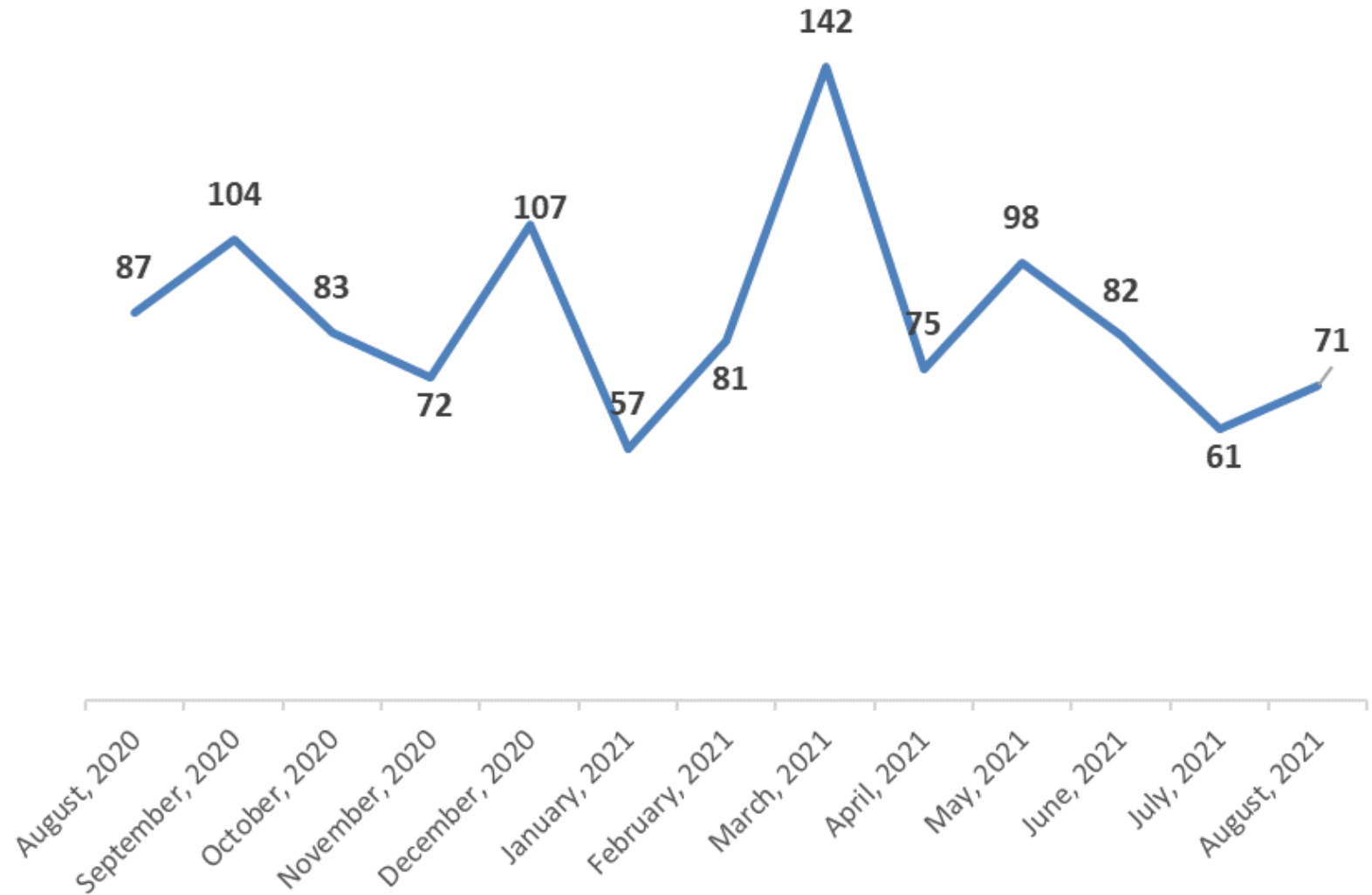

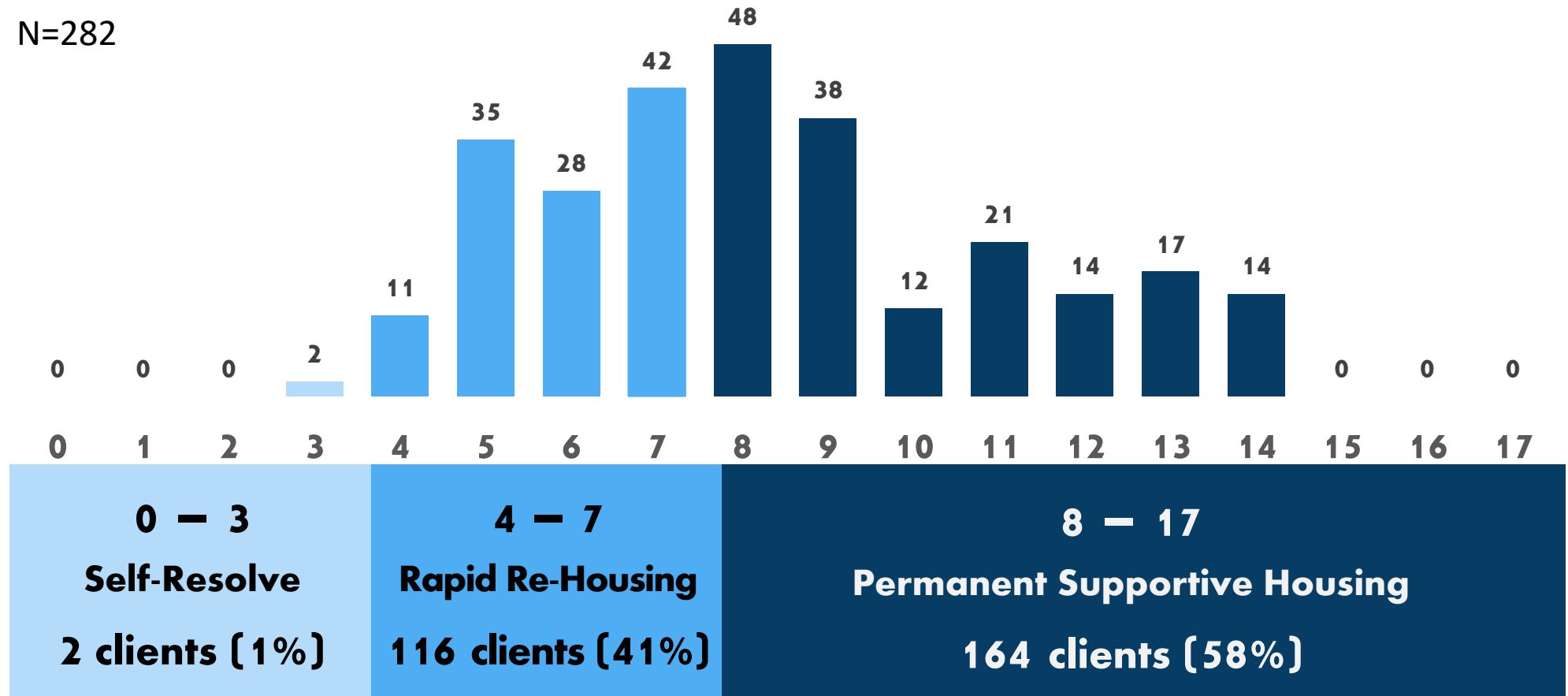

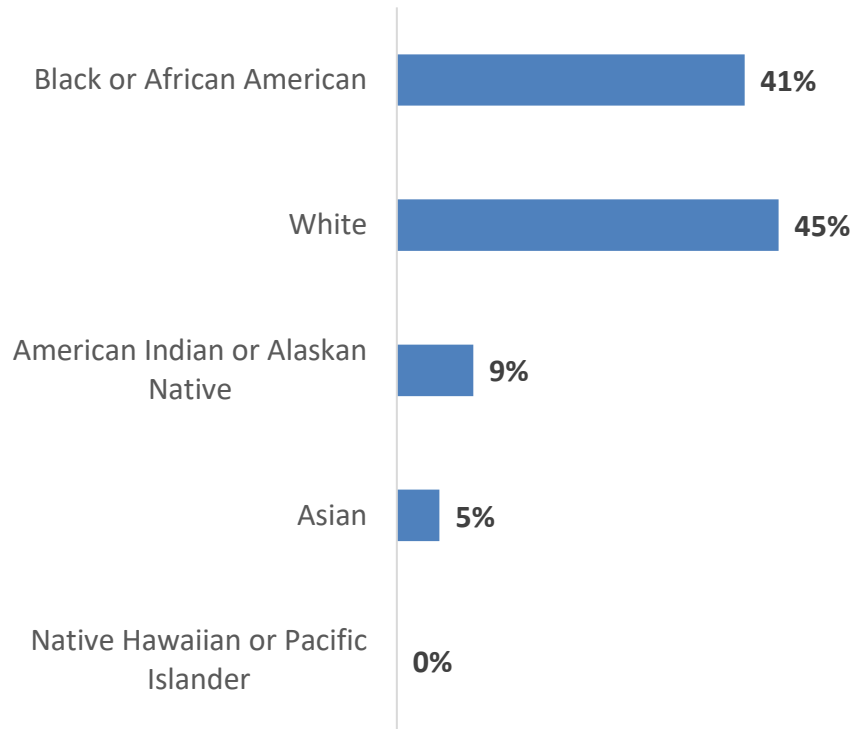


Chronic Exits To Housing

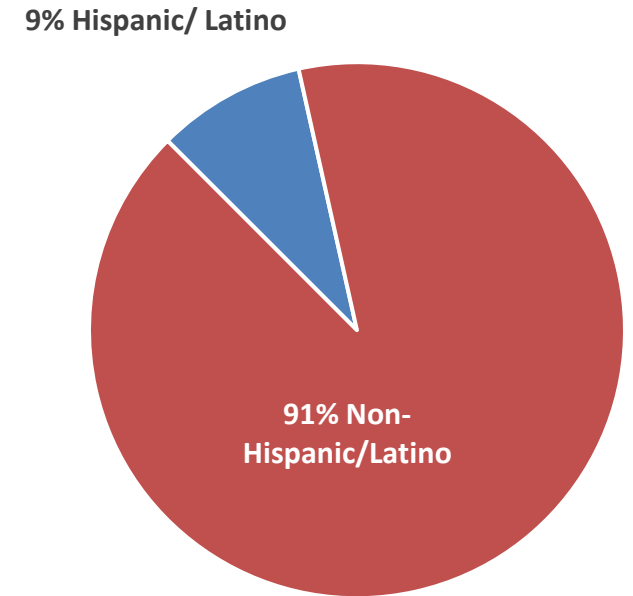

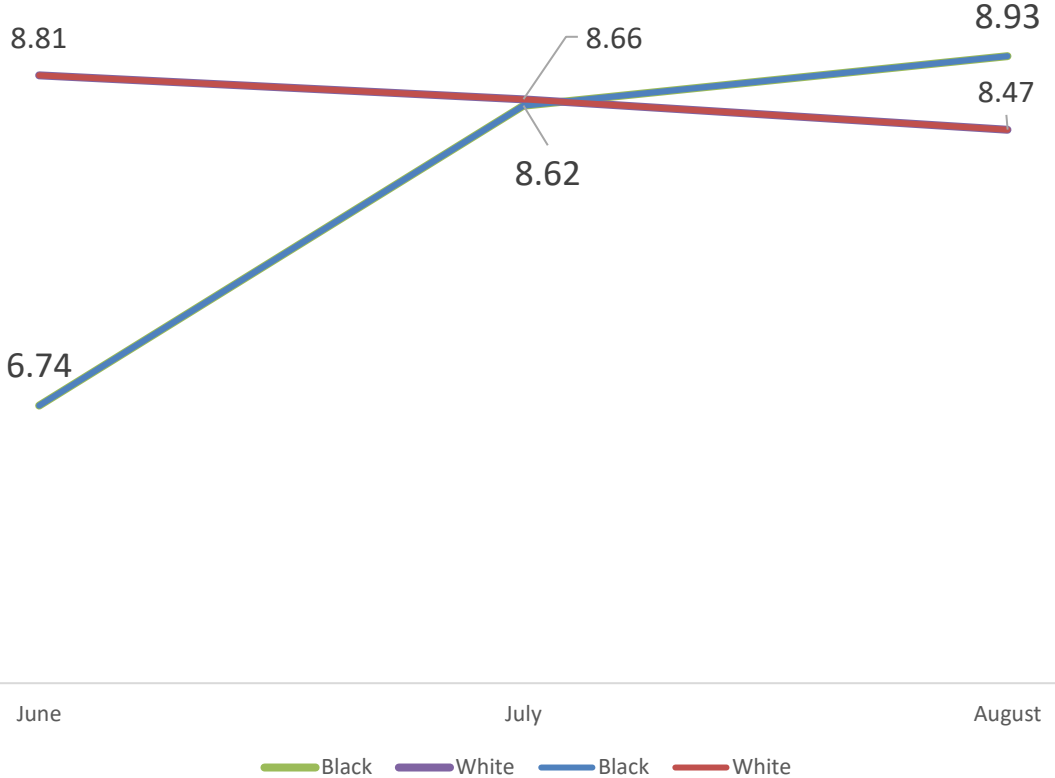


VI-SPDAT Scores: Racial Disparity Over Time



Average yearly scores, by race. There is a clear bias towards higher scores for white persons, with an average difference of .5 points. Since this assessment contributes to the prioritization of limited housing resources, lower scores for Black persons may indicate a systemic access issue.

VI-SPDAT Scores: Racial Disparity June to August

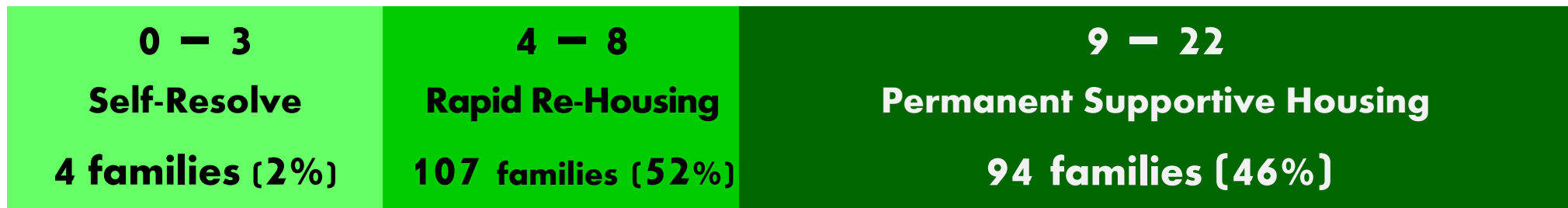
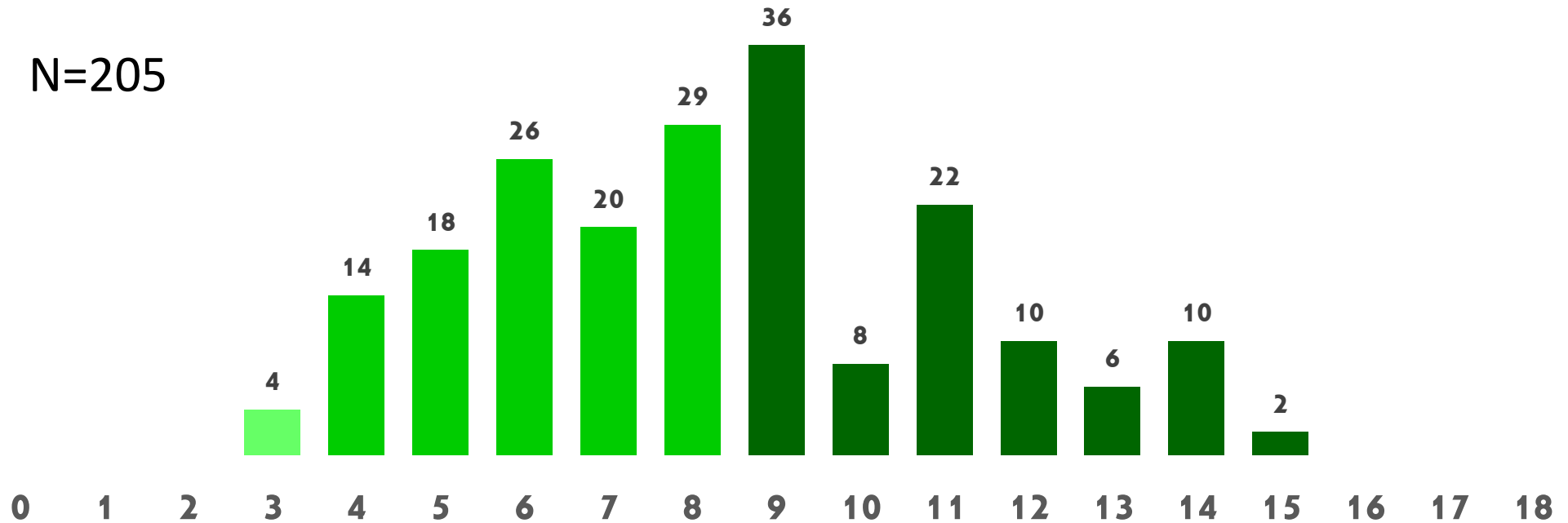


The racial disparity may not be observed each month but has been consistent over longer periods of time.

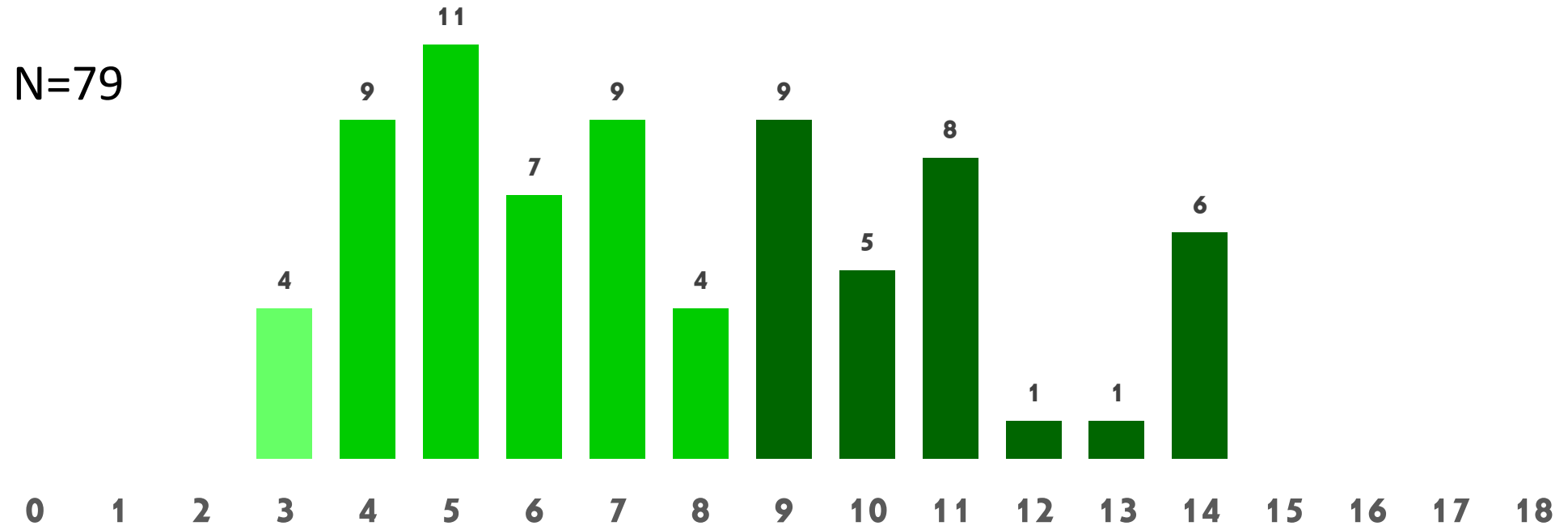
This past 3 months the disparity was .04 points higher for persons identifying as Black.

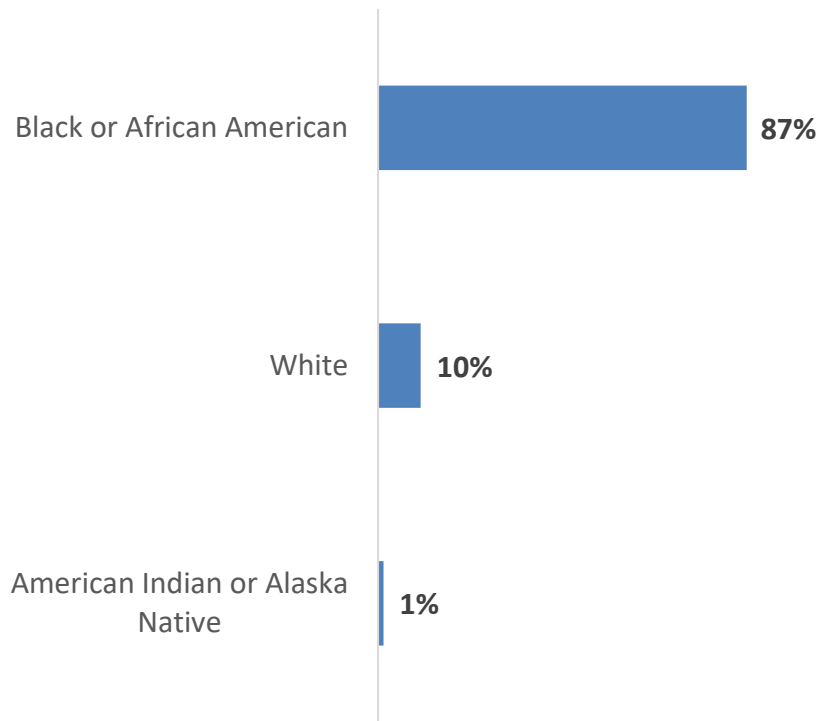

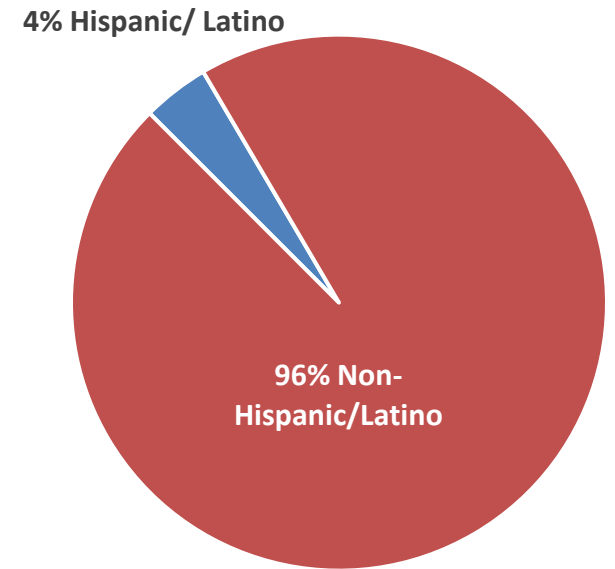

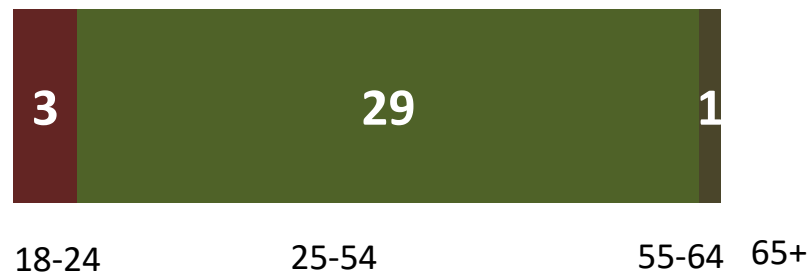

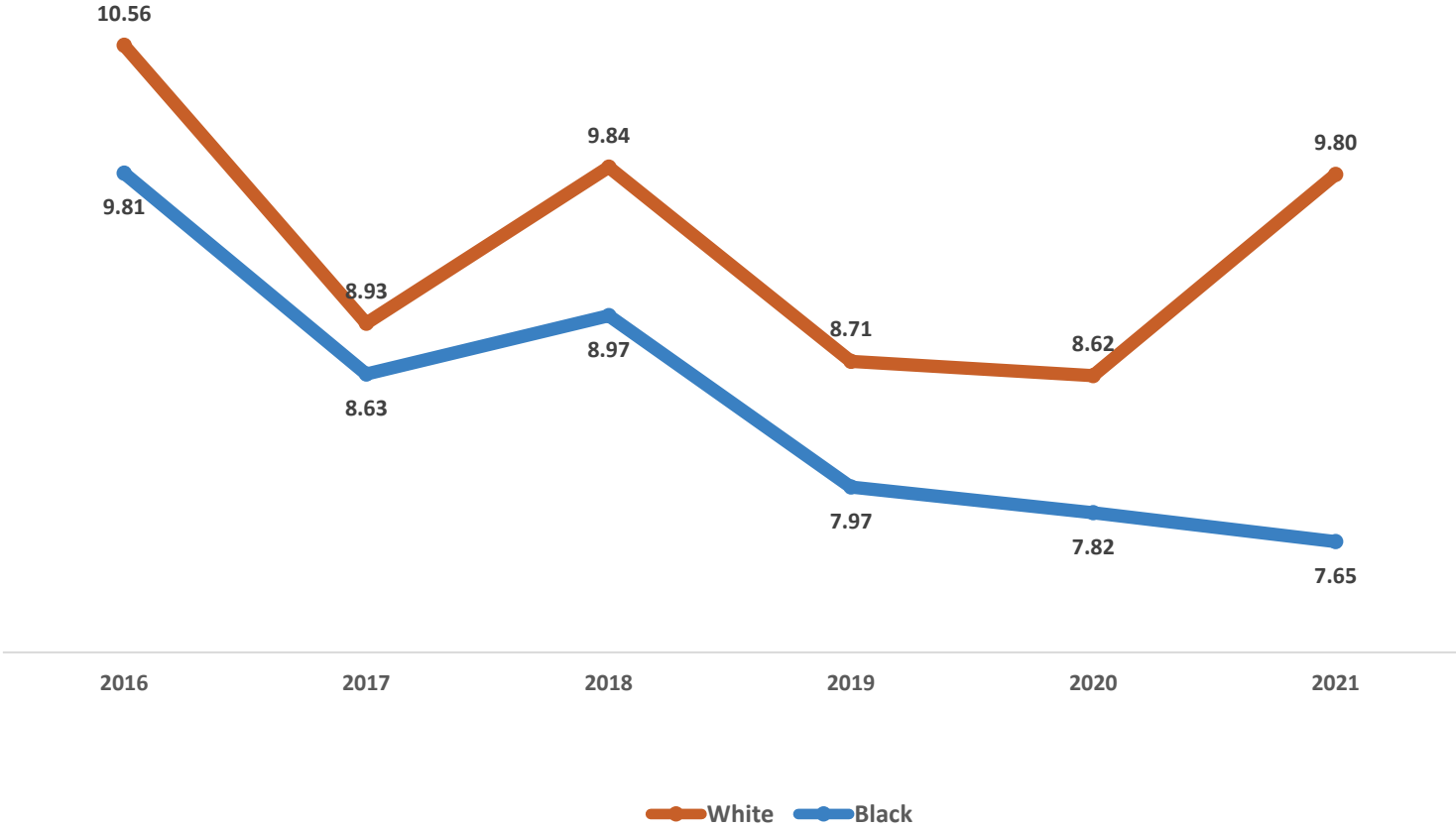

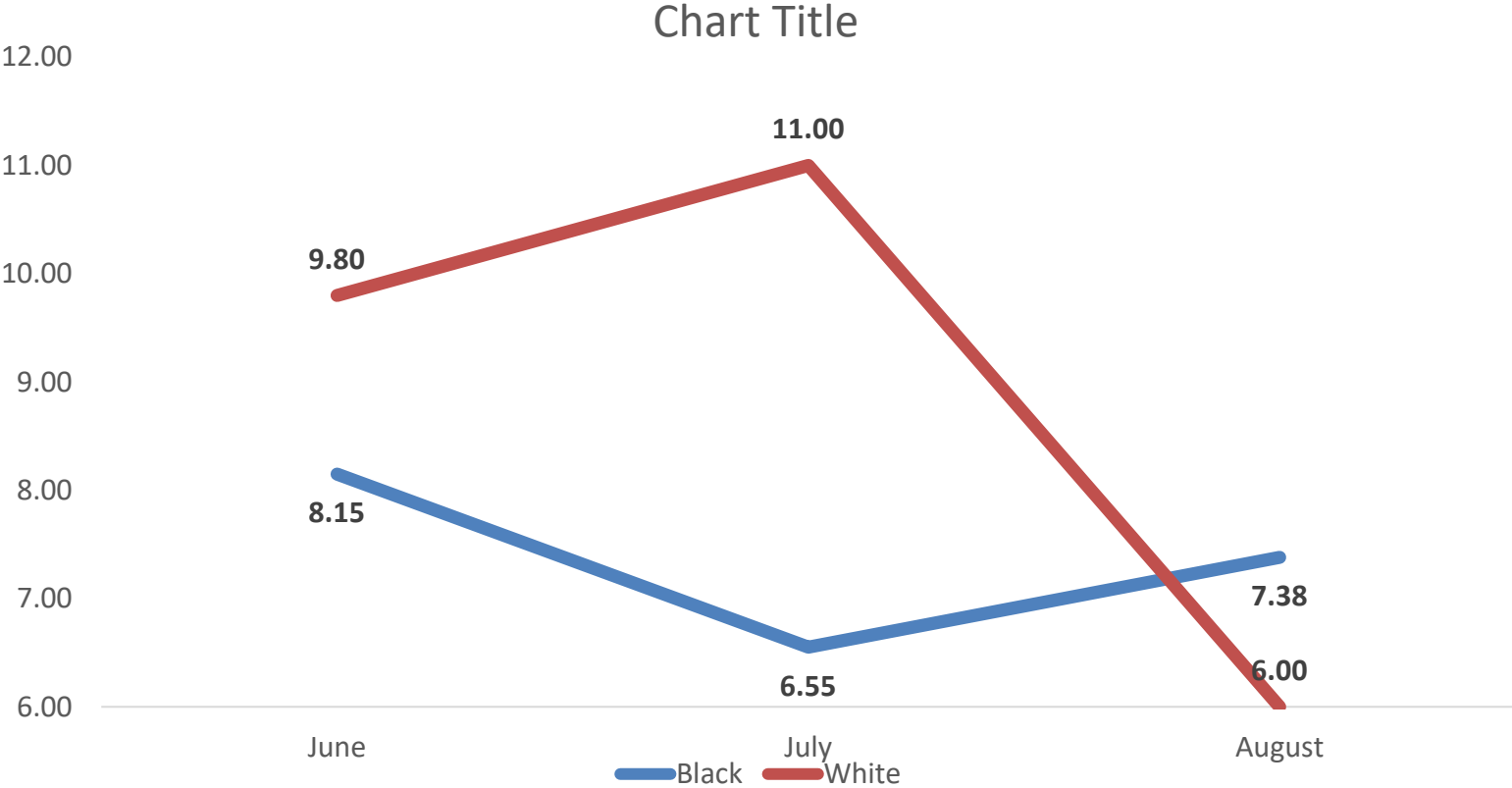


VI-F-SPDAT Scores: Racial Disparity Over Time



The average yearly family score, by race. As with individuals, there is a clear and consistent trend of higher scores for households with white heads of household. The gap so far in 2021 is over 1.5 points.
